CORVAIR MENTION IN WALL STREET JOURNAL

There was an article that appeared in the Saturday/Sunday (Oct. 29/30, 2011) edition of the Wall Street Journal citing Corvairs as being one of three cars "ripe for neo-retro stardom." The writer stated the following rules that made Corvair one of his top picks: 1.) The car has to be instantly recognizable, woven into the fabric of not just car literacy but cultural literacy. 2.) It has to be buildable. 3.) Some cars are such a product of their technical brief that they really can't be recreated. 4.) It has to be based on the manufacturer's existing platform. 5.) It has to provide the delight of rediscovery. His top three picks were: #1 - Austin Healey (SA-IC) Sprite; #2 - Chevrolet Corvair Corsa EV (meaning electric vehicle potential); #3 - 1934 Chrysler Air-

His comments on the Corvair were as follows: "The Corvair, which was rightfully dubbed by Ralph Nader in his book "Unsafe at Any Speed". would seem among the most tainted legacies in the business but styling was never its problem. This was an awesome looking car. Especially fetching and futuristic was the Corvair's nose, which didn't have a grill since the engine was air-cooled and in the rear. GM doesn't have a rear-engine platform and even Porsche abandoned air-cooling years ago - but the neo Corvair would make a perfect EV. And think of all the Nader-haters who'd buy one "out of spite." MEET BOB LUTZ

On 3 Dec. 2011, I brought 10+ people (including members of DACC and other car enthusiast friends of mine) with me to a secret undisclosed location to meet Mr. Bob Lutz (former Vice Chairman of GM), and to also look at some classic cars that are stored in a private warehouse. Mr. Lutz was there to promote/sell copies of his latest book, "Car Guys vs. Bean Counters" and was giving autographs as well. The event was hosted by an off grid car club who wish their identity and location remain anonymous.

I have visited this warehouse several times in the past; and, along with Mike McKeel, joined this club as well (which has approx. 500 members).

After speaking with the owner of the building and one of the club's leaders, I thanked them for allowing me to invite and bring members of DACC with me and mentioned that I was asked to do an article for our club newsletter regarding the event. They agreed to an article being done but asked me not to disclose the location of the warehouse, and I ask those who attended this event with me to do the same. Thank you.

This car club opens the warehouse to its members and their invited guests to view the stored classic cars which include Porsches, Mercedes, Alfa Romeos, Ferraris, Cadillacs, T-Birds, racing cars, etc. I was privileged to be allowed to bring my 1965 Corvair Monza into the building to be viewed by the estimated 150+ people who were present. It was funny to hear the side comments as I drove in

(which Mike heard) such as, "Wow!", "Look at the tag!" (my plate reads AIRKOOL); "Look! It even has a trailer hitch on it!"; "This must be the Christmas Corvair." (I had a red bow on the trunk and Christmas lights inside the car). Some asked me if my Corvair was a vintage racing car from the past (because I have wide tires along with racing numbers and stickers on it). I told them its' not a racing car from the past but that I currently have fun with it (wink, wink) including taking it to Milan Dragway for some test runs, etc. This shocked most of the guys who heard it, but they were even more shocked when they discovered how many Corvairs I have as I pulled out photos I've dubbed, "The Family Portraits" citing each personal name I gave them.

After everyone from DACC left. Mike and I had to stay behind because my car was blocked inside the building by other classics. As we remained there, we had a unique opportunity to have Bob Lutz to ourselves for a short time. This is when we got a few jewels of information. While he was autographing a gentleman's Chevy Volt on its engine lid, I asked Mr. Lutz if he would be so kind as to autograph my Corvair as well at which he stated, "I don't have anything to do with vehicles that I'm not personally involved with." At that moment, Mike jokingly responded with, "Oh yeah, so you don't want anything to do with the Corvair, huh?" Mr. Lutz replied, "Oh, that's not true. I really like the Corvair! As a matter of fact, it was the first new American car I ever purchased." Being the engineer that he is, Mike asked for more details about the car.

Mr. Lutz stated it was a 1962 Monza (Autumn Gold color), 102 HP, 4 door, 4 speed. He put after market items on it such as ceramic metallic brakes, EMPI camber compensator, Koni shocks, and Michelin radial tires. He ordered the car from a dealership out in Walnut Creek, CA, and "impatiently" waited 7 weeks for delivery. He said he loved 4 doors which delighted Mike as 4 door Corvairs are his favorite as well. We all shook hands after we spoke and that was better than an autograph to me as having a good conversation with a "car guy" more of a lasting leaves memory. We found out that Mr. Lutz drops in on this car club/warehouse from time to time and has been friends with the building's owner/club folks for approx. 15 years. I will let DACC know if and when Mr. Lutz will be making any future official appearances at this facility and, hopefully, be able to extend another invitation to those who wish to accompany me if it occurs.

With the Chevrolet 100 Year Celebration, many publications and reports have weighed in on the history of the Chevrolet Brand. After reading the special issue of Automotive News 100 year edition, (at over \$50.00 a copy) I found errors on the stated history. Remember history can be rewritten, many times. The section on the Chevrolet Corvair is a good example, I am sure that the reporter was not even born during the Corvairs in the market place. Time and time again they white wash the issues with a lawyer who gained fame during all the litigation as such.

It is every Corvair Club member's responsibility to set the record straight. While the series one Corvair had early problems, the remaining production of series two made up for lost time. Question...... what car continues to dominate racing in its class? ANSWER, the Yenko Stinger.

Two dominate areas contributed to the eventual demise of the brand. 1. The advent of emission controls to the engine, when you recirculate hot gases to a already hot air-cooled engine, you cannot sustain performance. 2. GM started to embark on common production parts across the product lines. Corvair had few; the 69 models shared Camaro bucket seats.

So at the end of the Autoweek article, they provided a small footnote, that a 1972 report commissioned by the National Highway Traffic Safety Administration and conducted by Texas A&M University, said the 1960-1963 Corvair had no greater potential for loss of control than similar competing cars. (What took them so long to publish that!!!!!!)
