My Latest Project -- Or --

Reasons to come to a DACC meeting

I found my latest project at the most recent DACC meeting. It was during a short part of the meeting called "Swap and Sell". I asked if anyone had a late model Corvair coupe for sale that was equipped with a Powerglide transmission. I was looking for a car for my friend Rod in Chicago. Since we have to add hand controls any 'Vair with a manual trans was out of the running. One member offered up a car that was iust a mile from our house in Farmington Hills. I had to check it out

Actually my son, Paul went to see it first. The seller, Chris Hines, stated that he would let it go for "not very much money". What does that mean to you? If you found a restored Duesenburg for less than a million dollars that might be considered "not very much money". But this was no Duesenburg. It was a 1967 Monza coupe with a 110 engine and the requisite automatic transmission. The car was still "Corvairshaped" but it did have a lot of rust in the floor pan area. This Monza started out life as a Tahoe Turquoise coupe with a black interior. Somewhere along the way it was re-sprayed Maroon. And the Maroon was fading fast. Chris said it was parked because it had a "rod knock". And of course the floor needed attention before the car could be driven again, so he parked it in his garage, just a mile from our place. And I had no idea it was there ... Until the DACC meeting. See where I'm going with this?

Paul reported to me that the car had potential. He and Chris push-

ed it outside so Paul could check it out. They did not discuss a price for purchase, but Chris only wanted "not very much money" for it. Okay, I'll take the bait. Over we went, driving my silver blue 1963 Monza sedan. Once I saw the car and noted that it had the rare factory A/C option (Note: Only 1,396 1967 Corvairs had A/C. And 1967 was the last year for the Corvair A/C option) I just had to figure out what "not very much money" amounted to. We danced around the price for a few minutes and then I offered \$400. Which was snapped up in an instant! Then Paul and I went back to Beacon Square to get the truck and empty flatbed trailer. In a matter of less than an hour Chris had his garage back (Mrs. was VERY happy) and some coin in his pocket. What Paul and I had remained to be seen.

We put the car in the garage and took stock of what we had. The body wasn't all that bad, but it was in worse condition than the Corvair I want to send off to Rod in Chicago. The floor needed help. The rest of the car was all there. All of the A/C parts were present except for the belt to the compressor. The compressor did turn over by hand, so it just might work. To get the engine fired up all we had to do was add a battery and prime the carbs with some fresh gas. Chris had told us that the car was towed down from Petoskey and had not been run for

4 years or so. The engine fired and ran but the fuel pump was leaking badly. We swapped in another used pump and re-fired the engine. I adjusted the idle speed and we both listened for a rod knock. There was none to be heard. Now maybe you have to get it out on the road and really warmed up to hear it but, so far so good. Cross your fingers and toes!

Paul really liked the looks of Bill Johnson's satin black '65 Monza coupe that was out in the parking lot at the meeting. So we are going to try to duplicate it with this '67. First order of biz was to improve the rolling stock. I found a set of 14" steel wheels on Craigslist for only \$50. My old buddy Clark Hartzel gave me a set of low profile 14" tires off one of his 'Vairs several years ago. So I mounted those tires on the newly painted steelies and the car looks better already. Next step is to fix the floor and then add the satin black and some deep window tint. As soon as we can get the air to crank out ice cubes Paul can cruise in style. Hopefully the car's debut will be the Homecoming in August. To that end Bill Johnson has agreed to give Paul advice on how he painted his car. Next stop Wal Mart for an even dozen rattle cans of satin black!

Stay tuned! If it works this could be one cool ride.
