Thoughts on the AAH experience

2 miles is a long way to go when you are walking in the DITCH! The Adopt A Highway section that CMI has taken on is a 2 mile stretch of Hiway 55 just west of Co Rd 19. Anyone familiar with Hiway55 knows where the BIG WOODS tavern is - - this section is immediately west of the BIG WOODS. Fortunately for us AAHers there is a very nice restaurant next door to the BIG WOODS called Dobo's Café. Anyone interested in a nice breakfast, feel free to drop in at Dobo's.

Now: more to the point of the AAH program. We walked in the ditch and picked up junk. None of us found any toxic waste or DRUG paraphernalia so that part was uneventful. We did find animals that were victims of "road kill", but most of them were long dead so they weren't even smelly! We found lots of car parts and truck parts along with an abundance of paper and plastic stuff that had been carried by someone to this place of "pitch it in the ditch". The material we picked up fell mostly into the last category, as expected, but I was surprised at the amount of car parts left from crashes - one lone tree had a particularly huge stash of front end shrapnel that was apparently supposed to disintegrate by itself in a hundred or so years. The tree was 50 feet from the road, all by itself, and had apparently been the unforgiving target of an errant automobile.

The grass had been cut last fall so it was only 6-8 inches tall...definitely walkable but not the "Ditch Pitch" – remember we were not on the road but on the side of the road that is definitely sloping downward – at a steep PITCH. Like I said the Ditch Pitch was a killer! After a couple hours of walking in the heavy grass with one leg shorter than the other It became obvious to me that this was going to be painful. Fortunately it rained and we called off the first run after only a mile or so. A few days later we came back with better weather and I had fortified my body with some Ibuprofen. Needless to say it all went splendidly for the second try at AAH.

We found a lot of stuff that had been there for years so I doubt we will need to do this more than twice a year, but we will let that decision be made by our chairperson Cliff Picht. He coordinated the whole process and got the yellow vests and the bags and coordinated the shuttle bus – provided ably by Carol Cook who ran back and forth keeping us all in our proper places.

AAH – a good program and a fun time for all – especially when we can start off so well with such a good breakfast!

A quick project for 2012

Since my Red Car began "movin' on" I have been working on a '66 2dr. It came from the factory with the standard 'inadequate' rear lighting (remember how good the '58 Impala's rear lights were?) so I got a pair of back-up light 'stampings' from Jim Brandberg and started snipping on them. Jim gave me two square panels that he deftly removed from a donor car. He gave me more iron than I needed so I started to snip and 'feel' the pieces onto the body in that "correct spot". Each time I cut - it got better and closer to what I wanted. When I was pretty certain the project was a "GO" I got out the screw gun and nailed the pieces onto the car! Then I measured to see they were in the right spot....there was some readjustment, but basically I knew what I wanted - - since I wanted them to look exactly the same as the rear lights on my '67.

Once the new holes were in place I started to cut away the old body pieces underneath. A sawzall works great for this job. I cut several times (which is why I had screwed the panels in place) and used each cut as a measuring tool to see that I didn't go too far. When I decided to stop cutting there was about a one inch overlap...good enough! With the screws still in place I tack welded all around the new panels, with about an inch between each tack. See pics.

These first two views of this operation show both sides of the welds and the overlap of the panels. I felt the overlap was functional as the welded area is now double strength and should be able to withstand my brute force style of body work!

The Wag-Niters Car Club welcomes you!



For those who don't know how slick the inside of this light area is on the factory model you can see the smooth area around the backup light socket in the second photo.



My body working will attempt to simulate this internal view! With that in mind see the third photo of the inside after that inner panel was torched and hammered. This effort produced two sort-of matching curved sections – that's why they had to be strong! Bondo and sandpaper should produce an acceptable inner view....I hope. Grinding off the external high points of the tack welds leaves us with the basic third light ready for the Bondo man.
