Some fuel savings tips from Consumer Reports (thanks Fran)

August 14, 2012 Balance

1.) **Drive at a moderate speed.** This is the biggest factor. Driving at 55mph instead of 65 or 75 will save you money.

- 2.) Drive smoothly. Avoid hard acceleration and braking whenever possible.
- 3.) **Reduce unnecessary drag.** At highway speeds more than 50 percent of engine power goes to overcome aerodynamic drag. So don't carry things on top of your car when you don't have to.
- 4.) **Don't use premium fuel if you don't have to**. If your car specifies regular fuel, don't buy premium under the mistaken belief that your engine will run better.
- 5.) Minimize driving with a cold engine. Engines run most efficiently when they are warm.
- 6.) **Keep tires properly inflated.** Check the pressure of you vehicle's tires at least once a month with a tire gauge.
- 7.) **Buy tires with lower rolling resistance.** A tire's rolling resistance can add or detract another 1 or 2 mpg.
- 8.) **Avoid idling for long periods.** As a rule, turn off your engine if you expect to sit more than about 30 seconds!
