

My First Corvair

My First Corvair: But before that, let me tell you about my first Corvair test drive. When they first came out in the fall of 1959 I saw the ads and thought 'I have to check this out', so I went to our local dealer in Aurora, IL. and got a test drive in one of the 4 red four door demonstrators they had. It was a 3 speed and I was impressed with the way it handled but it didn't have a lot of power. I told the salesman I liked the car, but at the time I was not able to buy it, as I had one child and one on the way and was working two jobs to save money for a down payment on a house. I told him 'maybe someday'?

Now for my first Corvair: In 1966 I was in my second new home as our family was growing. We had five children, one of whom was born with brain damage (she lived until age 18). This added significantly to our expenses so I took on a third job working with my brother installing TV antennas and towers on weekends. I found a Corvan and used it for this and as a daily driver. I gave up the part time jobs in the early 70's at the request of my full time job when I went into management. So I sold the Corvan.

I got back into Corvairs in 1982 with the purchase of a 1966 500 coupe, and in 1985 found the Fitch Sprint. I have bought and sold a few more and now have a 63 autocross car and a 61 Corvan.

That's my story and I'm sticking to it !!!

SECC 2014 Spring Autocross

First Coast Technical College (FCTC) St. Augustine, FL 14-16 March 2014

Sarah did it again: the weather for this weekend was beautiful, clear blue skies with moderate temperatures. The driving was also inspired with one of our own taking Fastest Time Of the Day (FTD) showing those water pumpers the way around the course. We had a total of 17 drivers (4 that were pre-registered did not make it) that made runs through the FCTC autocross routes. Once again, Saturday was more of a finesse course which included the serpentine portion and gates on the skid pad. Driving the car under control up to the limit to get as close as possible to the fastest line was paramount for a good time. Sunday was more of a wide open course that required more courage to get to the limit without going over it. Most all did this very well. We also had some new people that had never autocrossed before. All of those left with a smile on their face and addicted to the sport (a couple of those had only signed up for only one day but paid the difference so they could come back and run on Sunday). I had mentioned during the driver's meeting that you use the 1st run to get an idea of the correct lines through the course, the 2nd run you start pushing to those lines, the 3rd run you come close to achieving those lines, and the 4th run you might exceed either the car's or your capability as you go past those lines. This turned out to be more often true than not as many had their best times on their 3rd run. We had 6 water pumpers this year; several Mazda's, a Lexus and a Honda Civic. We also had our crack Corvair technicians (Dan and Gene) get one of our new member's car fixed with some carb work and elimination of some vacuum leaks that allowed him to participate both days.

Saturday afternoon runs went with out a hitch. The drivers were finding the limits and staying within them. Most all runs were run without hitting any cones. Almost all drivers improved their times on each consecutive run. There was plenty of time after the 4 timed runs to have fun runs. Some even improved their official timed runs during the fun runs even though they had a passenger ride along.

Sunday morning was cool which added an additional challenge of getting the tires to stick while running the fast course. All was going well till a cone was knocked down at the finish line which affected one of the timing sensors. Even though Jeff and Gene tried to line up the sensors, they had trouble getting the timing to cancel at the end of each car's run. We went to stop watches to get us through the first heat of drivers. During the switchover to the second heat, they found one of the cables was pulled loose from the connection. A field fix was applied which allowed us to be able to time the 2^{nd} heat. The only other delay happened when we had an off course event during a 4^{th} run; the tow rope had to be brought out and the car pulled from the muck.

All in all it was a great weekend. All cars and drivers survived. The Stewarts once again had lunch for us both days for a very reasonable price. The Stewarts also bought the Nature Coast Corvair Club Car. Can't wait till next year. Below are the results and pictures.
