Late Summer Activity at the Caveman Garage

Here in Southeast Michigan we had a hot Summer which was our reward for a cold and snowy Winter. The temps are down and now might be a good time to service that gas heater in your CaveMobile. If you have one...

There has been a lot of activity at the Caveman Garage this past month. First on the agenda was the re-powering of "Stubby". Last year Stubby fell ill and I had to do an engine transplant. Somehow the new engine was rejected by the recipient and I had to do it all over again. This time we installed a fresh "crate" 110 engine that was destined for a friend in New Jersey. He asked me to road test his purchase for 250 miles to assure that it would be ready to install when it made it to the East coast. What better way to put miles on his engine than in Stubby? This engine swap was very successful. The new powerplant purs like a kitten. Too bad I have to pull it out and do the engine swap thing yet again.

They say, "The third time is the Charm". Where they talking about putting engines in Stubby? I found the cause of failure with Stubby's replacement engine. One cylinder had a broken ring. That allowed a lot of oil to get past it and the resulting smoke out the tailpipe was the reason for the repeat repair. I also found that the other rings were not sealing against the cylinder walls very well. They were worn down quite a bit. Good ole' Grumpy Clark Hartzel came to the rescue with a partial set of new piston rings for the project. Problem solved. That engine is all buttoned back together and ready for another engine swap thrash at the Caveman Garage. Watch this space!

The next project that we tackled this month was the rescue and revival of a 1968 Monza coupe. You read about it on Page One of the Aircooler a few months back. This car was involved in a front end collision back in 1984. The owner drove it home from the crash site and then parked in a shed on his property just a few miles from our base here in Farmington Hills. Thirty years later it was time to sell it to somebody who could repair the damage and return the car to its former glory. That somebody was me!

With some help from Bill Johnson the car was extricated from its thirty year parking space and dragged up on my flatbed trailer. Amazingly the tires still held air and only one wheel was stuck. We towed the car back to my son Paul's house and planned our next move. Friend Casey Sheskey stopped by with the Pizza (Thanks, Casey!) and we got to work. The inside of the car had a lot of mildew present so I brought along some CLR Mold and Mildew cleaner. Stuff works great! With the inside of the car mildewfree Bill manned the shop vac so he could evict the remnants of the mouse colony that called this car home for so many years. Then we washed the outside. Yeah, I know. That was a vein move, but we wanted to impress Paul when he got home from work.

Next up was an attempt to get the engine to turn over. Normally I would just get a big friggin' 3/4" box wrench and reef on the crankshaft pulley nut. This being a 1968 Corvair it had the second pulley on the crank for the smog pump. I couldn't get my wrench down there to try to turn the engine over. Oh well, let's just hook up a battery and see what happens. To shorten up this article a bit let me say that with just addition of a fresh battery, a new set of points and Bill's cool auxiliary fuel system the car started right up! How about that after 30 years of inactivity? We still have to free up the clutch disc from the pressure plate/flywheel (rusted) and fix the brakes (hard pedal - but no action at the brake shoes = stuck wheel cylinders). And then there is that nasty dent in the front. Paul says he'll drive it with the dent. Can you imagine seeing a Corvair coming at you with the front end already proving Ralph's point? Would you get out of the way? Paul also thought it would be easy to find parking places in a crowded lot. Who wants to park next to a wreck? I suggested that he look for a light post or a tree or something large to park up against. Sorta like driving around in a accident looking for a place to happen?




