Rearview Mirror

The 40th Anniversary Celebration of Corvair Houston was held on September 20, 2014, at Venture Tech, which was also the site of the 30th Anniversary Celebration. Larry Keast, the founder of the company, is also a long-time car hobbyist with a number of vehicles which have been restored or are in the process of restoration housed in the building where we held our celebration. He is also the founder of America in Recovery, an organization dedicated to helping recovering addicts, ex-convicts, and others find their way back into gainful employment. He believes that these people deserve a second chance, and he has successfully hired a large portion of his company's employees from their ranks.

Inside the large building, tables decorated with models of Corvairs were set up, and a screen behind the podium showed Corvairs and club activities over the years. The meal was catered by Fajita Willie's, and the food seemed to meet

with everyone's approval.

More than ninety people, some arriving in their Corvairs, attended the celebration. Included in the group were those who founded the organization in 1974 and many others who discovered the club over the next forty years. Among the founders were Guy Bobkoff, Gene Marshall, Charles Lee, and Bob Goodman, four of the evening's speakers. They were joined by a fifth, long-time member, Greg Riley, and told of the club's earliest days and described the wide range of people who were drawn together by an affinity for that most unusual of American cars, the Corvair. The Corvair seems to have attracted many people who admired its advanced technology, engineers, architects, technical people, designers, and even doctors and lawyers, and all those who believed it was too good a car to just let it go to the scrapyards. They told of the the Corvair's rather amazing successes on the racetrack, a car with such great handling characteristics that with its small six cylinder engine it could beat V 8 powered Mustangs and Corvettes on short track races. A car that is happiest on twisty, hilly, challenging roads. But they emphasized that the continued healthy existence of Corvair Houston is because the members truly enjoy each others company; that there are always enough people knowledgeable about the inner workings of the car, and who are willing to help those who do not have the same mechanical



aptitude, so that these engineering marvels can be kept on the road; and that it is an enjoyable social organization. Our weekend drives almost always begin with breakfast and end with lunch: the annual Christmas party is always the best-attended event: the club occasionally gets together for outings that are not actually car-related. The club also sponsors charitable activities for veterans and people in need. According to the founders, this spirit as a social organization has carried the club through forty years and will continue to do so.

Corvair Houston board of directors chose to recognize Larry Keast, Charles Lee, and Bob Goodman with Honorary Life Memberships in Corvair Houston for their contributions to the organization. Guy Bobkoff and Gene Marshall were previously recognized with lifetime memberships for the same reasons. We thank them for their efforts on behalf of Corvair Houston.

A few things we're expecting include a drag bike (172 in 1/8 mile), a Bonneville C/Gas Camaro, a couple of 32 roadsters, a 170 mph Ducati road racer, a 262 mph Bonneville record setting roadster, a Model AA Ford truck, an original 46 Dodge 4 door and a restored 56 T-bird. 
