Last Convertible at the Caveman Garage

What is this? Has Hell frozen over? Did I hear that the Caveman has purchased a 1969 Corvair?

Well, you heard right Bunkie. Not only did the Caveman buy a 1969 Corvair, he bought the very last 1969 Corvair Convertible ever built! Serial number 9W705997. It is the second newest known surviving Corvair since the last one (9W706000) has been missing in action since May of 1969 and there is no current record of the whereabouts of Corvair # 9W705998. The newest Corvair left on the planet is the blue Monza coupe owned by the Corvair Preservation Foundation (9W705999) and on display at the Chevrolet Hall of Fame Museum in Decatur, Illinois. This convertible is a California survivor with original top and interior and one re-spray in it's past. The odometer shows a little over 72,000 miles and it runs and drives fine.

The car came to the Caveman Garage by way of Stafford, Virginia and before that North Carolina and of course California. First time it was North of the Mason-Dixon Line was last week when the previous owner delivered to Hershey, PA and a waiting trailer to bring it back home to Michigan.

Alright. So much for Late Models. I guess I will have to do penance for buying a 1969 Corvair and allowing it into my collection of mostly 1960's? In addition to that recent purchase there has been a flurry of activity at the Caveman Garage revolving around 1960 models. First off, I finished putting the Sateen Silver 700 sedan back together after having to replace the master cylinder. I did figure out the "trick" to mounting the master up under the dash - first you must disconnect the clutch cable! This step is only required on 1960 and 1961 Corvairs. If you skip this step you will find it very difficult to get the three bolts for the master to line up in the holes on the bulkhead. I sure did!


Next 1960 project was to repair the Roman Red 700 sedan's clutch and parking brake cables. Somehow the previous owner had the cables mis-routed and generally messed up. After sorting that out I was able to put a rebuilt brake master cylinder in the car and get that much closer to having a functional brake system. Then I found a buyer for the car who wanted to start his first project car. We towed the car down to Garden City to a place very close to where former DACC member Don Arner lived. Hopefully the new young owner will join the club as the newest Rookie Caveman.

The last order of business this month is the purchase of a very nice 1960 700 sedan that was feeling sick. The fellow that I bought it from did a lot

of repairs and upgrades and the car looks really sharp. Unfortunately the engine decided to take an early retirement. Not to worry! The deal includes a "selectused" engine that is ready to pop in there. So tonight I plan to run up to Oxford and grab the car. Tomorrow he will go into the Caveman Garage and by Sunday afternoon he should be ready to drive out under his own (new) power. - Caveman Pete

*** MEET THE MAKERS *** OF THE WATERLESS WONDER FROM YPSILANTI

As some of you already know, I've been in the process of organizing a unique event for next year on May 14, 2015, at the Ypsilanti Automotive Heritage Museum reuniting those who helped design and build the Chevy Corvair with all of us Corvair owners and enthusiasts. It's been an interesting journey locating the retirees. I've been in contact and addressed the UAW Local 1776 (former Willow Run Assembly Retirees), Flint GM Truck & Bus UAW Local 598 Retirees, the Willow Run Salaried Retirees, and am in the process of locating Canadian Corvair workers in Ontario (CAW Local 222). I will be attending and addressing the UAW Local 735 (GM Powertrain) meeting in November because some Willow Run workers transferred over when the plant I will be contacting the closed. GM Power Train Plant Retirees in Tonawanda, NY.

I have a St. Louis contact for those retirees who built the FC's in Kansas City, MO (thanks to Mike Hall). I am also looking for the GM Tech Center engineer retirees. I have had the good fortune to meet and interview some GM car designers (thanks to Stu Shuster). A gentleman by the name of Robert Edwards is film documenting stories of all car designers for cars from 1946-1973 and I had the pleasure to speak with him (after interviewing a GM car designer).

Mr. Edwards has been kind to loan us (for exhibit on May 14th only) three original sketches of proposed Corvair designs by Carl Renner. I may share one photo of these sketches as a teaser (in the near future) but you will have to attend the event to see the others. I want to thank all the Corvair people I've contacted who have been so helpful, i.e. Stu Shuster, Mike Hall, Corvair historian Dave Newell (for all his information on GM plant history, etc.) and anyone else I may have forgotten to mention.

In addition to inviting the retirees to this event, I've been conducting film and audio interviews (74 as of today with more to follow) of the retiree's stories during Corvair production years. These interviews have been very interesting. I've also had a custom signature book created for the workers to sign for themselves and in memoriam of those who have passed away (110 names so far) which will be donated to the museum along with the documented interviews for historical purposes.

I've received some plant memorabilia donations which were given to the museum; one of which was a replacement of the booklet given to the employees when the Willow Run plant closed (the museum copy was missing and now we replaced it with a mint condition copy). One of the unique donations I submitted to the museum from a former worker was four metal handcrafted aircraft models made from scrap metal pieces of Corvairs from the Fisher Body side of the plant (one was a helicopter, one was the starship Enterprise from Star Trek, one was a bi-plane, and one was a water airplane).

A Willow Run Assembly jacket along with a copy of an aerial

photo of the Willow Run Plant (during production years) will be off at the event. You do not need to be present to win; are \$1.00 each or 6 for \$5.00. I will be donating the original aerial photo to the museum (at the museum's request because they don't have a photo like mine).

One exciting thing that has happened is that there was an article about this upcoming event published in the Fall 2014 Region 1-A Newspaper that is distributed nationwide to 50,000 UAW Retiree members. Hopefully, we will find more retirees who helped build Corvairs.


