
#### Prep notice for the February Meeting in Long Lake. Clamps for the air cleaner...or "Cleaner Clamps"


The 'Brake hold down pins' are available from CLARK'S. A kit for 2-wheels of an FC, (\$9), will give you springs and pins for four "cleaner clamps". Assuming every one you make comes out fine you will have a spare set to give to your friend(s). Buy supplies now before the Holiday Rush!

I did a little testing and found the springs take about 25# to close the windings all the way. 10-20 pounds of force is plenty to hold the air cleaner down snugly. To verify the modified pins can take the stress of this application I set up a tester and found the "barbed end" can lift at least 75# and show no bending at all. I wasn't able to make a tester that could measure the breaking of one.


We plan to meet at Dave Peterson's shop for the February meeting. John will have directions to Long Lake. Bring your pins, springs, etc. If you have a vise-grip and a file, put your name on it and bring it along. Dremel tool, too...great!

There are four different lengths of pins. They will all work but the shorter ones will just be tighter. 2-7/16" down to 2-1/16"





Clamp pin in vise with arrow verticle. Use hacksaw to cut slot at 'A' and file to flatten pin at 'B'. Then file two sides of round end to be parallel to arrow. 'C'





Dave has lots of tools so there shouldn't be any problems, except if you don't bring your own pins.

This is how the clamp fits on the air cleaner. The longer pin is easier to install because it doesn't bend the spring as far.



This photo shows how the sharp end of the steel clamp engages the hole in the Carb's Aluminum air horn.

#### Lights ON!!

In the spring and in the fall we often drive with the sun sitting right on the road in front of us – so we are driving "blind" and cannot see the oncoming traffic - - except when the opposing vehicles have their lights ON! So we will discuss Daylight Running Lites (DRL).

Modern cars have separate lights for separate functions and more often than not run both the Parking lights with the Daylight Running Lights to ensure that the width of the vehicle is identifiable even if a bulb fails. These cars also often display "DRL" on the dash to signify these lights are on any time the car is in operation. As it has become apparent to the CMI members that driving during the day with the headlights on is a beneficial safety feature I have offered to write a description for modification of the CORVAIR wiring harness. There are two variations of this modification (the "Deluxe" and the "Low Cost") that will be discussed. Both result in Daylight Running Lights, but each offers its own set of advantages. Find the one you like, but read about both.

CORVAIRS have Headlights, Parking Lights, Taillights and Dash lights too. The "Deluxe" modification allows us to turn on <u>ALL</u> of our lights automatically which allows us to drive without having to think about them; they are <u>all on</u> when the engine is running. Day or night, your presence is made known to oncoming motorists as well as those approaching you from the rear. Additionally, there is no danger of accidentally forgetting to turn off your lights because the headlight switch has not been manually engaged. It's all, Automatic

The alternative "low cost" modification allows us to turn on only the headlights automatically while leaving the other lights manually operational using the headlight switch. Because some lights would be automatically turned on and others left manual, we have to think about "which ones are on...when". Example: Automatically turning on the 'head-lamps-alone' gives us the Daytime Running Lite without the Taillights or the dash, etc. It can then fool us, when driving at night, into thinking our Tail-end is lit when we can obviously SEE that our Headlights are on. We can, of course, manually pull on the switch so that our lights are on during the day but then we often forget to turn them off...and have a dead battery! Bummer!

So, we can do the Deluxe "all the lights" modification which takes a little more time, Or...we can do the Low Cost, "Just the Fronts".

Let me give you a quick rundown on the difference between the quick Low Cost (easier) wiring and the Deluxe "ALL the lights" wiring:

First, there are two Head-Light Switches found in CORVAIRs that do the same thing but are not shaped the same. The longer unit was used in the Earlies and the square one was found in the Lates. We'll talk about how to modify both units to add DRLs.

Second, we will be adding a relay controlled by the GEN's tell-tale light that will activate <u>after</u> the engine has started (not before cranking or during cranking) and will turn off when the engine and GEN stops. You don't have to think about this part once it's installed and it will work every time as this is a **robust** design. This relay will power both your Hi and Low-Beams every time your engine starts or stops. Choosing this low cost option is very quick as it only involves adding one wire from the relay to the dimmer switch. This is the "cheaper" version of a Daytime Running Light (DRL). However, it does not provide the Parking lights to be on for that rare time of having a burned-out headlight.

NOTE: For several reasons I DO NOT endorse modifications that use the three terminal oil pressure sensor sold by vendors for powering electric fuel pumps; ask me and I'll tell you why.

The 'Deluxe' version of a DRL modification on a CORVAIR involves the exact same sequence described above with the additional time involved in tying the relay wire "UP" to the other two wires, shown later.



"UP" means you, or your technician, has to look UP under the dash to find the correct wires to tap into. A lot of people do not like to work upside down. It is possible to find the wires and access them without pulling down the wiring harness but I find it makes the job more certain; better quality and with less chance of error. It's not easy to take the bundle down and peal back the black tape to get at the wires going in to the Light Switch but you'll be happier with the results. This extra investment of *time*, and effort, is the cost difference between the low-cost DRL and a Deluxe-DRL. If you hire it done the Deluxe will cost more money.

This extra investment provides these DRL features:

Headlights ON whenever the car is running – High beam or Low beam.

Front running lights – formerly called 'PARK'. ...can show the width of the car if needed.

Dash (panel) lights - - with the rotating dimmer when you are driving at night.

Taillights - - The same as you would normally have. Signals are unaffected by this Mod.

ALL of the functions of the normal MANUAL Headlight Switch, as if you had pulled the handle yourself.....only now they will not only come on every time you start-up, but they will also go DARK, automatically

# **Short lesson on Circuits**



When a battery is connected to a switch and that switch goes to a lamp, closing the switch turns on the lamp.



When that switch is open the lamp stays dark.




When a different switch is connected to this same circuit, it can turn the lamp on even when the first switch is open.

#### The Lesson:

If the first switch is a Headlight switch and the second switch is a relay, both from the same battery, the relay can turn on the headlights when the NORMAL switch is not pulled and there will be no conflict in the wiring. Either one, or both, will turn on the lights.


#### NOW IS WHEN WE MAKE THIS STORY INTO A CORVAIR-DRL STORY.



When the engine starts and the "gen/reg" gets going, the GEN-lite goes out. That means the wire to the relay (labeled 'A') is HOT! When current goes through the coils of a relay it makes a magnet that slams the contacts together, connecting B+ to the DRL. The Man/Auto Switch allows you to operate all lights manually.

This new wire from the relay goes straight down to the dimmer switch for the quick DRL.

The Deluxe model uses all of the 'quick' s circuitry.



Here are a few pics to guide you. Early and late switch bottoms .... Early and late connectors from your perspective that are labeled to guide you in how to tie the proper leads together to make a Deluxe DRL.


#### **DO NOT CUT THESE WIRES,**


#### <u>SIMPLY EXPOSE THEM AND SOLDER THEM TOGETHER WITH THE NEW DRL WIRE.</u>



Violet, Black and Lt. Blue on the EM Note: The big #14 wire (blk/LM, lt blu/EM) is the wire that goes down to the Dimmer Switch:

Brown, black and purple on the Lates:





Also: when these three wires are together your manual headlight switch will no longer have the PARK function. Any position on Manual will get you all the lights.



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
