MOTOR REBUILD 63 GREENBRIER

Well it all over but the shouting. Yes, the motor is alive and running fine. The driveway mechanic alas Ray Dubia and my good friend Jim Taylor came over after breakfast at Pete's Coney Island in Clarkston today. It's nice to have extra hands. I put Ray in the driver seat so he wouldn't get hurt. HA! HA! Really he was running the electric fuel pump and the ignition switch while Jim Taylor and I worked on the engine. We had to make a priming tool out of a long screw driver. My V8 priming tool was to short. We primed the motor until we had oil come out of the rockers.

Installed the distributor. First attempt, we were 180 degree out. Of course what do you except 50/50 chance of putting it in wrong. MY LUCK.......Well once we reinstalled the distributor correctly she fired right up. Adjusted the distributor a little by ear and run the engine at 2000 rpm for twenty minute to break in the lifters and cam. After we ran the engine for the require 20 minutes, we put the timing light on it and did some fine tuning. WOW What a difference!

What a rebuild motor sounds and feel like. I didn't think the motor was that bad when Ray and I left for our Texas adventure. I must say I had a great time building the motor and would suggest that fellow members not to be afraid of rebuilding their motors if need be. I found a great machine shop to do my heads, bore the cylinders, installed the rods on my new pistons from Clarks and polish the crank. The machine shop was Baldwin Machining on Baldwin road in Pontiac. They have been there for as long as I remember. I grew up in Pontiac and can remember my dad using them.

It was nothing putting the motor back together. I did get my Christmas presents from the family the new rockers and push rods. I forgot to mention I sent the cam to Oregon cam grinders in Washington State. I have their phone number and address if you need their services. I'll sit down and add up what the total cost was and will let you know. So if vou do decide to rebuild your motor what to expect expense wise. I might drive it to the January meeting if it doesn't snow. Well until the next project have fun and keep that Corvair running. from TIM BRAMBLE

Okay, Pete wanted me to find someone from among all my guys I've been interviewing to come and speak at one of our winter meeting's. I hope I've delivered here because I have a special treat for everyone: We will have several guest speakers visiting. These are folks I have interviewed or met while preparing for the upcoming "Meet the Makers" program set for May 14th. Our special guest speaker for the evening (and one of my favorite interviews and new friend) is Mr. Paul Deesen – former Asst. Chief Designer for General Motors who worked from 1954-1996. Although the designers like to be referred to as "stylers", I found out that Paul spent most of his career in the production studio and is credited with (and I'm just listing his Corvair accomplishments here as he has many others too numerous to mention): giving the 1961 Corvair its' facelift, designing emblems, designing the side of the Corvair Monza GT, and having a patent on the 1961 wheel cover. Paul will be telling us some stories, displaying sketches, and we will enjoy a slide presentation of some of his factory sketches of other car designs. Paul is a great story teller and I love his sense of humor (make sure to remind him to tell you the story about the day he and other stylers went for a ride in an early Corvair during a work day and what happened next, and what practical jokes he pulled on Bill Mitchell and other stylers – it's very funny). There is a current Feb. 2015 Hemmings Classic Car Magazine out right now (go and buy one) and on page 80 under the "I Was There" section, Paul tells his first hand account of working in the studio and on the Corvair Monza GT. Paul will be bringing a friend who is also an incredible illustrator

GOVERNOR DECLARES MAY 14 2015 "CHEVROLET CORVAIR APPRECIATION DAY"

In November 2014, I approached the Board members of the Twp. of Ypsilanti (location of the Willow Run Assembly Plant) to sign a proclamation I wrote declaring May 14th "Chevrolet Corvair Appreciation Day" in conjunction with the upcoming "Meet the Makers of the Chevrolet Corvair" event. This event will pay tribute to the auto workers & GM car designers who helped build these wonderful vehicles. Once the Board approved and signed one for the Township, I immediately submitted it with a request to the office of Governor Snyder to proclaim this special day for the entire State of Michigan. I explained my reasons for writing this resolution included tying it in with the upcoming 'Meet the Makers' event; to publicly pay tribute and honor to the dedicated auto workers, engineers, and GM car designers who helped build an incredible vehicle, and to recognize and highlight Corvair's attributes and historical contributions to the automotive industry.

In preparation for this event, I let the Governor know that I was conducting ongoing film and audio interviews of the auto workers & car designers stories to document for historical purposes (120 interviews so far with more to do). I just wanted to do something to celebrate and put a positive spotlight on a marvelous feat of design and engineering and say thank you to the makers of this Air-Cooled Wonder we call CORVAIR. This event will be kept on a positive plane, and I promised the UAW workers that this was going to be their day and that "you know who" will not be invited as it is a sore subject with them (hint: don't bring it up). The Governor signed several original proclamations in order that I could present one to our DACC President (Pete Cimbala), one to the UAW Union Local 1776 – former Willow Run Assembly workers, and one to give to a special guest of honor. Copies will be given to the Ypsilanti Auto Museum, CORSA, and CPF.

It appears that the signing of the State of Michigan proclamation has created an increasing interest for the upcoming "Meet the Makers" event. Needless to say, the UAW hourly, salary workers, and car designers are thrilled by all this attention. When I made the announcement at the UAW meeting last month, everyone became silent when they heard that the Governor signed the proclamation and I read a couple of lines from it and they all broke out in loud applause. Cool. huh! The makers don't understand what 'Corvair Rock Stars' they are in our world (that's what I call them) and I told them to get ready because they'll probably be asked for their autographs. I know I'll be asking. This event has turned me into a kid inside of a Corvair Candy Store; and I've enjoyed every moment of meeting the Makers, documenting their stories, making new lifelong friends, and looking forward to paying honor to these wonderful people on May 14th. After getting to know them, they've made me love my Corvairs even more now (if that's possible because I'm very passionate about those cars and trucks).
