GET THE RIGHT GAS CAP

At the recent Meet the Makers of the Chevrolet Corvair event in Ypsilanti we had an issue with gas caps. Seems that no matter hard we tried to adhere to the rules and regulations concerning parking cars inside their building we found it was a moving target. Drive 'em in, but disconnect the batteries. Oh yes, you have to have a locking gas cap. Once inside the building we were not allowed to start the Corvairs up and drive them back outside. Okay. During the program while the cars were sitting several developed gasoline leaks. Oops! That is worse than just having a regular nonlocking gas cap in my opinion. But the regs stated that we had to have locking ones, so Corvair Lady Eva ordered some up for us. And that is when the problem began.

The Corvair fuel system, as with all cars and trucks of the same era were not closed systems as they are today. Current vehicles are required to vent any vapors or pressure through a filter and then capture those vapors and re-run them through the engine and out the tail pipe(s). Cleaner air is the goal. In the '60's there were no such regulations so the fuel systems were vented to the atmosphere through the cap on the vehicle's filler neck. If you look at the gas cap on your Corvair it will say "Vented". Using a non-vented cap is a bad idea.

Sitting in the hanger at the Yankee Air Museum the Corvairs were building up pressure in their fuel tanks. After a while that pressure was looking for an escape route. It couldn't take the normal path as designed out the gas cap. The first victim was Dave Manaco's beautiful Rampside pickup truck. It started leaking near the front bumper which had several people wondering how that could be. Then we recognized the optional gas heater on Dave's truck. The heater provided the path of least resistance to the fuel pressure. Once we figured out what was happening we checked other cars on display and found similar pressure in them as well.

So the moral of the story is if you have to have a locking gas cap, make sure it is of the vented variety. If you are one of the members who got a locking cap for this event (MasterPro Select #5092) DO NOT use it on your 'Vair! It will be fine on any modern car with evaporative emissions equipment, but it will not work on a Corvair or other pre-emissions car or truck. And we always say, Safety First! **PETE K**

PLYMOUTH, MI, USA - I was talking to a friend of mine (Ross Newton) about 18 months ago, just some idle chat between two car guys, he had a 1964 Corvair convertible, I have a 1965 Stingray, which I purchased back in 1979. During the course of conversation, Ross brought up the subject of the Corvair Homecoming that they had been going to for the last 7-8 years, in Plymouth Michigan and what fun it was and that the people were so friendly and helpful.

So after his praise of this event my wife and I decided to check it out, this was in Aug. 2013. During our stay (It is a 3 day event) Ross got interested in a 1962 coupe, says he rarely puts up the top down on the convertible any more. Anyway the visit was great and we met a lot of nice people. There also was a fantastic all Corvair flea markets but, as I did not own one, all I could do was to just appreciate it.

Fast forward a month or so and we are down in Hamilton looking at this 1962 coupe which was fine, and then I asked Ross if he was going to buy it. "Well," he said "it is a nice car, it's just what I was looking for, and do you want to buy mine?" Well I did not see that one coming, but he gave me a price that I could not refuse, and my wife loved the butternut yellow paint so we surprisingly became the owner of a Corvair which is basically my wife's car. It really is an economical, fun vehicle, and turns a lot of heads, plus the inevitable question, "the engine is where?"

So we joined the D.A.C.C. (Detroit Area Corvair Club) and here we are Aug. 2014 returning from the 2014 Homecoming which is a 12 to 15 car contingence from Ontario, for which the club made us all very welcome. We cannot praise this club enough. First off, the people, and characters, that made up this 3 day show are incredible; some of the folks that we have met both this year and last year have become very good friends. There is so much good

and knowledgeable help available from other members, this is backed up by a very dedicated member staff that supply lunches and supper every night. Remember that this a 3 day event, of course the hotel supplies a full breakfast every morning, bacon, eggs, etc., and by the way there is a keg in the hospitality room for anyone who likes free beer all weekend. Each day there are events for the children, and the wives and girlfriends. [Mary Kay meetings for the ladies They really do try to make it fun for everyone.

One of the events that children and adults alike get involved in and in some cases take quite seriously are the rocker [valve] cover races. These are rocker covers that have designer wheels attached. [They are] max weight of 4-1/2 lbs. and race down a custom designed track, lots of fun. On the last day, people pick 10 of their favorite cars from which [25] are picked for the 2015 club calendar.

I can honestly say it is by far the best show and get together that I have attended in the past 35 years. Some of the figures from this year's Homecoming are: 300 plus people fed, in the Hospitality Room, twice a day, 156 registration, 80 people toured the GM Heritage Museum, 36 swap meet places, 92 rooms booked at the hotel. as of Sat. afternoon 85 cars attended. The cost of all this is \$50.00 a car for the 3 days. You also get a special rate on the hotel for this event. The cost to join the club is [\$20.00 a year, CORSA membership is highly recommended.] The whole event is held at the hotel in the parking lot, as the whole hotel is pretty much taken over by the club. In fact, this Quality Inn in Plymouth Michigan has the record for the longest repeat event to be held at the same location; I believe it to be around 30 years. After all this, the club makes a profit. Corvair culture is certainly alive and well in Plymouth Michigan, and we are pleased to be a part of it, can't wait for next year.


So. Somebody out there please help me move these very modern Corvairs so I can get back to wrenching on Caveman cars. Please? - Caveman Pete


