Leaving Houston late in June, Corvair Houston club members came by different routes at different times through different states in a wide range of vehicles; from 50-yearold Corvairs to late model cars and trucks, the only things that they shared were their destination, the 2015 Corsa convention in Knoxville, Tennessee, and that virtually all had air-conditioning. Mike and Audrey Tidwell brought their '64 Monza coupe with a set of aluminum wheels that really changed the whole appearance of the car; Ricki and Sally Jannise drove their '65 Corsa coupe; Jerry and Loretta Kelley arrived in their '64 Monza convertible; Greg Fox, with his son, David, drove his rare Corvair motor home with what looked like an all new interior; Mark and Waynette Clarke with Waymon Worsham (Waynette's dad) cruised in their roomy Toyota van; Jon and Betty Protteau pulled a teardrop trailer with their Mazda CX5; and Todd Hasfjord and Hong Nga arrived via plane arriving

at different times. None of the members experienced any major problems traveling which speaks for the dependability of the Corvair when given some care over the years.

The Knoxville Marriott Hotel provided an excellent venue for the convention, and the Knoxville Area Corvair Club had everything well-organized. All of the usual driving events were offered: the economy run, autocross, and rally. In addition, there were tours of the nearby Dollywood, a steam-engine train tour along the river, and a riverboat dinner/cruise. And of course the many subgroups under the Corsa umbrella met: Virtual Vairs Group, Corvanatics, 1960 Caveman Group, Stock Corvair, V-8 Corvair Group, and others. Clark's Corvair Parts brought hundreds of parts available with a 5 - 10% discount, and other vendors also offered items that usually pertained to Corvairs. The activities ran nonstop for 14 to 16 hours each day; something for everyone. And if that wasn't enough to keep

visitors occupied, with the location near the Smoky Mountains National Park, the Blue Ridge Parkway, Gatlinburg, and Dollywood, it was possible to wander off and find even more things to see and do.

For example, the Tidwells and Jannises decided that it would be fun to run the Tail of the Dragon, a road that runs along the Tennessee/ North Carolina border and which contains 318 curves in 11 miles. It was truly amazing to follow the two Corvairs driven by Mike Tidwell and Ricki Jannise; one an early model with powerglide and the other a late model with a 4-speed. Granted that they are both excellent drivers who know how to handle a car, it was still a shock at how difficult it was to keep up with those 50-year-old Corvairs when we were following in a two-year-old Mazda CX5 which is a small suv that drives and handles very well on curvy roads. It was easy to see how Corvairs were able to win races against much more powerful cars. They really

handle well even today.

After running the "Dragon", we continued into the Smoky Mountains National Park and discovered why it is the most-visited park in the U.S. park system. It offers mile after mile of beautiful forests and mountains on well-maintained roads. clean air, and cooler temperatures, especially in the higher elevations. We climbed one of the steeper grades and watched the outside temperature drop from 87 to 77, and it also offered a convenient overlook area at that point.

If you have not attended a Corsa convention, make it a point to try to come to one in the future. Next summer, it will be held in Springfield, Illinois. At these conventions, you will find people from all around the country, and even from other countries, all of whom share a common interest in a rather unique American car, the one with engine in the trunk and the trunk under the hood. And one that is still affordable.


