She called 911 and the Farmington Hills Fire Department showed up and whisked me away to Botsford Hospital. The EMT's diagnosed the problem and the Staff at Botsford were able to correct it before it was too late.

The problem was a 100% blockage of the main artery to the heart. Somewhere along the line someone with no sense of humor nick-named that type of problem "The Widow-maker". I'm not laughing. They were able to clear the blockage with a catheter and the put in a stent. About this time the heart was tired of being poked and decided to stop. To correct the flatline condition they used a de-fib device. It only took six tries to get the old heart going again. Ask me what it feels like to be hit with 1000 volts. The last one worked and unfortunately it woke me up and WOW!

So now I'm home and recovering. Every day from here on out is a gift. I'll try to make the best of them. My Corvair activities will be curtailed for some time. Lots of other changes. too. HOMECOMING UPDATE (CONTINUED FROM JUNE) VALVE COVER RACER

I thought it would be good idea to print what the CORSA guidelines are on how to make a Valve Cover Racer. You still have plenty of time to build your potential winner. Race procedures will be explained on race day. We hope to see new entries this year now that you know how to construct your racer.

Racer Specifications:

- 1. Must have Corvair valve cover used in construction.
- 2. Gravity powered only, no motors, springs, magnets, jet-propelled, etc.
- 3. Maximum weight 4.5 pounds, no minimum weight.
- 4. Maximum length 16" long, maximum width 8" including tires.
- 5. No part of racer to hang over start gate which is 3" in height.

It is recommended that entrants make their racers with the wheels being the widest part of the racer.

DEATH OF JOE STRAYHORN 5 17

I'm sad to announce that Joseph "Joe" Strayhorn, who played a key role in the production of the Corvair at the Willow Run Assembly Plant, passed away on May 11th. He was 91 years old. Joe began his employment with Chevrolet in 1952 in St. Louis, MO, working on the first Corvettes produced. He then transferred to the Willow Run Assembly Plant in Ypsilanti, MI, in 1955 as Foreman of the Truck Plant. In 1960, he was made General Foreman of the Corvair Plant for the next three years, and was upgraded to 8th level Senior Reliability Engineer from 1968-1969 being the Superintendent of the last six thousand 1969 Corvairs built. Everyone at Willow Run knew who Joe Strayhorn was, and I considered him to be one of the "Rock Stars" of those who had a hand in making that air-cooled wonder. Out of all the cars produced at Willow Run, Joe's favorite car was the Corvair. He drove the first four door Monza that was made as a company car, and later bought it. He owned a total of three Corvairs. Joe met his wife at Willow Run and they were married for over 57 years and had four children. She would sometimes accuse him of being married to Corvair more than her due to his long hours spent at the plant. Joe stated that one of the thrills of his life came when he got to test drive a Corvair going 100mph at the GM Proving Grounds in Milford, Joe Strayhorn was also the gentleman who was famously known as being one of the last persons photographed in the last made 1969 Corvair (car #6000) on the last day of production (May 14, 1969). I had the privilege of getting to know him from the interviews we did at his house and other locations for my Corvair history preservation project, and from his participation as one of my guest speakers at the "Meet the Makers of the Chevrolet Corvair" event on May 14, 2015. He told me he was excited he to share his stories and participate with these projects. Joe was considered one of the "good guys" and he will be missed by his Willow Run family as well as myself. On a personal note, I did visit the service for Joe and Joe's sons enjoyed showing their children the Corvair I brought as Joe's met up with his family. grandchildren had never seen a Corvair in person. The "YPSIBLT" plate with its tribute to the Willow Run workers touched their hearts. His daughter, Caroline, told me something humorous that I want to share with my Corvair family as I think you will enjoy hearing it as I did when she told me: died, the grown kids gathered around his hospital bed trying to cheer him up. In an attempt to make their dad laugh, they began to ask him, "Come on now, it's time for you to tell us: Where did you hide that last Corvair (car #6000); what did you do with it? We know you have it hidden somewhere. You can tell us now, where did you put it?" While laughing to what she told me, I said, "Are you kidding me? You asked him that? What did your dad say to all of you joking around like this?" Chuckling herself, she replied, "He just said, I don't know where that car is!" They said their dad had a good sense of humor. Well, if he does know where that last Corvair is, he took the secret with him. **Corvair Lady (Eva McGuire)**


