The June meeting was the first of the summer months to be held at Hickory Hollow in the upstairs air-conditioned room, for which we are grateful. Many thanks to Mike, our gracious host as manager of Hickory Hollow, for providing the meeting place.

Just like last year we had a good turnout of Corvair folks to enjoy the food and fun together. It seemed a little harder to get the large group of thirty-five calmed down to start the meeting. The room was abuzz with conversation, of which much was about Corvairs and the summer ahead, I am sure. Even if it wasn't, it sounded as if they were all talking about something, you get the idea.

Club President Mike Tidwell brought the meeting to order and talked about the flood victim relief, collection and upcoming events. There was an issue with the Saturday Houston Ship Channel Tour which he and Audrey cleared up along with instructions for those that would be

attending. More about that subject in a moment.

Mike then went on to a mini tech session on early rear wheel bearing maintenance. As he said, owners of an early model often forget about those bearings until they fail. In just a little time one can do some prevention by removing the rear axle just far enough to split the bearing apart, cleaning and greasing it with a quality hi temperature grease. Many of the bearing grease products on the shelf now have some moly in them.

Mike went on to say that even he had experienced this issue recently with replacement bearings he installed and not done the greasing maintenance.

This is somewhat due to the age of the bearings and the fact that each bearing contains about a teaspoon of lubricant.


He admonished all early owners to spend some time and do it. Thanks Mike.




