In 1963, he married Margaret Bowles. In 1967, the couple


moved to Red Wing where he taught Band for the Red Wing School District.


CMI Fall Color Run & Becker's Barn Tour



This story goes back quite a ways but I'll spare you all from that (for now). Suffice it to say that there are many cars that I'd love to own. Many are Corvairs some are not. Over the last five years, maybe more, I've taken an intense interest in arguably the most luxurious Corvair that came from the factory. In my opinion, that is the 1962 Monza with the cloth bench seat. Somewhere back in my dusty memory banks I remember seeing a very nice tan '62 Monza with the gold cloth interior at a CORSA annual convention.

It reminded me of the big Chevrolets of the day like the Impala or Caprice with the cloth bench seats. Anyway, my search for one of my own has been off and on over several years. These cars don't often come up for sale. (I think I've seen four or five for sale in the past six years.) I even had Clark's make custom seat covers for my '65 Monza convertible using the cloth that was original for the '62.

Although we don't have any idea how many '62 Monza sedans or wagons were made with the cloth bench seats, I've seen very few. I believe that it was a credit option because the standard Monza had vinyl bucket seats.

Anyway, a few weeks back, HACOA member Travis Bolton emailed me a Craigslist ad for a '62 Monza sedan with a cloth bench seat and it was local. Now remember, I already have too many cars. I found out that the car was in Prairie Village, KS. Wow, I could at least go see it. The posted pictures were very poor quality so didn't provide much information. After seeing it, I contemplated it for several days.

As far as I could tell it has/had no rust.

Possibly the best part, beside the original cloth interior, is that the car has 28,000 miles! The car was part of an estate and needed to be sold because the home where it was parked was for sale. The contact person was the son of the gentleman whose estate was being settled. I made him an offer that I felt accurately reflected the value of the car that hadn't been run since 1996 and presented with no brakes. Once we agreed on a price, I took Stefani over to see it. She saw it and said (don't remember her exact words), "You need to buy that." Cool! Now, when to get it?

My days off are Tuesday and Sunday and it seems like Sundays are always booked. I put out some feelers and thought I'd start with those who live closest to where the car was. Mark Whitman and Scott Allison volunteered to assist on Monday (Labor Day). I arrived around 10 a.m. and Mark and Scott pulled up right behind me. We backed my trailer up to the garage and began to load it up. Mark was kind enough to bring his portable air compressor so we aired up all the tires and used my winch to pull it onto my trailer. A great big thanks to Mark and Scott for sacrificing their Monday morning to help. The trip from Prairie Village to Lee's Summit was uneventful.

I got the car home and spent a good part of the afternoon cleaning it. In the glove box I found almost complete ownership history with Kansas registrations and what appears to be receipts for every service ever performed on the car; all the way back to 10/19/1962 when it was purchased new and partially paid for by trading a 1947 Packard coupe. Wow, what a change, '47 Packard to

'62 Corvair! Anyway, it's at my house now and next up is the project of going through the brakes and getting the engine started

Cruise to New Ulm

CMI had a special meeting venue on September 8th. Rather than our traditional second Tuesday of the month meeting we held our meeting on Thursday to coincide with the New Ulm Car Hop and Shop cruise night. For the cruise we had four Corvairs in the show, Chuck Johnson's blue '64 Spyder, Dean Williams (from LeSeuer) was present with his original Rampside, and I had both my '69 Coupe and recently acquired '66 Sedan. There were about 80 cars from the area for the cruise.

Thanks to connections (i.e. Cara) we met in the New Ulm Chamber of Commerce meeting room. Friday morning we all met at Perkins in New Ulm for breakfast. After breakfast we drove to Flandrau State Park just outside of town to learn the history of the park and its use during WWII as a prisoner of war camp. Our tour guide, Scott, was very informative and told us some interesting facts about the Flandrau. We toured the beach house which was built in the 1930s and is the only structure in the park system styled like a German building in keeping with the local architecture. Then it was a short drive to the group camp for a fascinating history lesson on its use as a POW camp. In all there were eight POW camps in Minnesota and roughly 120 German prisoners were housed from late 1944 through the summer of 1945. One New Ulm family was fined \$300 for allowing a POW stay at their house over a weekend.

After the tour, we broke for lunch, with half the group trying out Plaza Garibaldi, the excellent Mexican restaurant in town (not everything is German in New Ulm). We then met up at Schell's Brewery for a tour and free beer. After the tour and beer samples (six in all) we visited in the beer garden until it was time to head home. In all we had twelve members for the tours and everyone had a great time.
