Engine Oil Bath

First off I would like to thank all of those who helped me diagnose and repair my car from its timely or untimely explosion. For those of you who remember back at the July meeting my '65 convertible had decided to have the oil pressure switch go and give its self an oil bath on the way to the meeting.

Let me explain the events leading up to that day as they were all but uneventful. As all of you know every Corvair leaks some amount of fluid otherwise we wouldn't be able to find our way home, but I had decided to attempt to fix some of my oil leaks. In the time working on my Corvair I knew the oil leak was coming from at least one of three different places the oil cooler, top block cover, or the engine adapter plate. I tore into the engine and start with the adapter plate and replace that gasket but that didn't look like the problem so next was the oil cooler. I pulled that off and the O-rings were hard as a rock, changed them out and wonder do I want to change the block cover gaskets or bet on the O-rings. I took my chances and decided not to and put the engine back together. I started it and it's running rough.

When I began this project the engine was running just fine so I try my best to tune the engine with no luck, I get a hold of Pete K. and ask if I can come up and have him look at it.

He tells me to come up on Saturday and we can have a tune up party and get the red '63 tuned as well. As we dive into my car we end up pulling the primaries and find I'm missing a handful of parts between the two carbs and have been running off the main and not the idle circuits. We rebuilt the two carbs and tune up my car as the next day is Eva's party and I want to take the car. While at the party I had Mike look at my car to see if we missed anything and lo and behold the right side primary was leaking gas onto the sheet

great, ready for the hour trip to Waterford for the meeting the next day. Ian comes over and my mom rides with him and they lead us to the Elks Club, we get stuck in bumper to bumper traffic on a 95 degree day. I turn on the heater knowing the engine is hot and getting hotter attempting to cool it down, and as soon as I turn down the side street to the Elks my temperature light comes on. It shuts off fast and comes back on as I turn into the parking lot, I shut off the engine and coast into the parking spot.

After the meeting and through lots of dripping oil and discussion we fixed the Oil Pressure switch. The interesting thing of all of this is since I have owned that car the engine stamp behind the adapter plate has always been covered with oil, even after I have cleaned it. Since changing the switch till I left for school no more oil has built up on the engine code, so after six vears and over 6000 miles on the hottest day I have yet to drive the car it decides to go. Call it magic, call it coincidence I don't care which but I am glad it went when it did. **Gary Komora**
