TREASURER'S REPORT

Recent gains include \$43.00 in dues and estimated \$0.11 in dividends. We spent \$50.00 as entrance fee for our group to visit and tour the Honor Point Military and Aerospace Museum. Balances now stand at: \$99.89 in Checking, \$1167.07 in Savings, and our total worth is \$1266.96.

While the club is not in any financial difficulty, payment of one's dues indicates interest in the Corvair automobile and the continued operation and success of the Inland Northwest Corvair Club. Continued consideration as a member is not fair to those who regularly pay their dues. At the end of 2017, anyone with dues owing for two years or more (last dues paid in 2015 or

earlier), and who has not been active in club events will be dropped from the membership roster. Continuing forward, anyone more than two years in arrears, by month, will be dropped from the roster.

INCC membership is \$15.00 per year. CORSA members pay \$13.00 for INCC membership.

Payment of one year's dues extends membership one year from your current date of expiration or one year from the date payment is received. We will waive payment of back dues, unless you wish to pay them. We simply want those on the roster to be paid up for the current membership year.






