# Project Police

Owen Strawn has been working in the engine compartment of his UltraVan. Owen had the unused holes in his top shroud welded up, then blasted and painted it along with other brackets and pulleys. He upgraded his alternator and in the process of rewiring it cleaned up the other wiring in the engine compartment. Owen also added a screen over the fan opening to prevent critters from nesting while the coach sits.

Bill Smith discovered a badly frayed clutch cable when he went to put the tunnel cover on his '62 coupe. He brought the coupe out to the Kalp shop to use the lift. With some help from **Greg Renfro** and **Terry Kalp** the new cable got threaded thru the proper pulleys and adjusted. Finally the tunnel covers could be installed.

Ned Madsen put all new gauges in the gold sedan, including a GPS speedometer. Ned is still working on getting his air conditioning sorted out. Presently Clark's Corvair is shipping him a new compressor to replace the defective one. He built new speaker boxes for the gold sedan and had them covered and installed. While in the building phase, Ned has created a couple of prototype consoles for the white coupe.

**Greg Renfro** pulled the gas tank out of his Sport Wagon and has purchased all the parts he needs to rebuild the brake system.

Alex Moats did some trading with Terry Kalp and now has his grandfather's Bell Telephone Van. Alex and Terry got the van started up and running off an auxiliary gas tank. Leaking pushrod tube O-rings and valve cover gasket were replaced on the driver's side by Alex. Future projects include improving the brakes and replacing a badly bent shift tube.

Lyle Ackerman and Terry put Lyle's '62 coupe up on the lift at the Kalp Shop to try to stop some automatic transmission fluid leaks. The transmission pan was drained and pulled. While the pan was getting cleaned and straightened, Terry pulled the shift cable and TV valve arm to replace the O-rings on those parts. The clean pan and a new gasket were installed and fluid added. When started the Corvair only had drive, no neutral or reverse. The shift cable needed to be reinstalled correctly. After a couple of tries and Terry figuring out when the manual says counter clockwise that clockwise does not work, all was well.


