Instead of a testing the cars capability at the track this was a month's long expedition through the jungles of Panama and Columbia. This area is known as the Darien Gap. This is a region where the Panamanian and Columbian borders meet and are separated by deep jungle terrain with zero infrastructure to make such a crossing during that time in a 4 wheeled vehicle. This is an area that would have tested the best of any off-road 4x4 vehicles. The 3 Corvairs were flanked by a support crew with 4x4 Chevrolet trucks. If you watch the Chevrolet promotional film on You Tube you will find that these Corvairs run a like a Timex "they take a beating but keep on

ticking". Pretty amazing stuff for the time. What impressed me the most was the ability for the Corvairs to be able to "Ford" the rivers. We might have been able to deploy some our Corvairs during the Houston Floods based on how these cars performed when crossing some of those rivers. # What's This about Autocross?

I first became acquainted with the event called autocross two years ago when Corvair Houston converted a donated 1967 Coupe with automatic transmission into a race car. This car was a mess when we started on it as a club project but with some members effort became a star and was later purchased by club member Todd Hasfjord. It was during that time I revived my much younger life of Go-Kart racing. So, in a way, you could say autocross is Go-Karts for us big kids. In many ways those who have participated, and some spectators could identify with that comparison.

After all, you are on a marked course in a motorized vehicle with the ambition of seeing how fast you can wag your way from start to finish in hopes of beating the others in your class. May I say; autocross racing is addictive?

It just seems that four runs are not enough to satisfy one's need for driving the course as fast as you can. The clenching

of your teeth and gripping the wheel as you tromp the accelerator down the straight away into the next turn. Your mind churns as you think through the corrections in steering, hoping not to spin out or go off track, to achieve the very best time for the run. Maybe you get the idea or know firsthand the thrill. The excitement sticks with anyone who has had the experience. This brings me to the story....

This year we had a Corvair Houston club competition in which some members competed for the best two out of three. One of the runs was to be at Heritage Days held in Mineral Wells and sponsored by NTCA. In speaking with event coordinator Tom Wright, I was informed that the autocross is really the central part of Heritage Days. Tom said, "It is a place where we can come out and have a fun time and do it inexpensively." I know they have worked hard to keep this racing event open for enthusiasts. Heritage Days 2017 was attended by members from Corvair Houston, Central Oklahoma Corvair Association and North Texas Corvair Association.

This year I was out on the track for the driver training, taking the photos seen here and other places and thinking about how to get the best shots. Last year during the event I was stationed near the fence and far from the action. Needless to say, the photos were not great. At the end of training I asked where I could shoot from, expecting to be told again to get off the track, but instead was directed to find a volunteer spotter and we could be as close as fifty feet. tioned ourselves out close to a turn to get the best action. I was elated about the potential. Thanks to Ed and the race official.

Ed is a hard luck member who had experienced engine trouble on the drive from Houston to Mineral Wells. I helped him resolve many of the issues, but a loose rocker arm was just too much for the parking lot repair. He had participated in the CH club competition, mentioned earlier, and so wanted to experience this leg of the circuit too.

This brings me to the point that I was thinking. Autocross, at least as we have seen, is great fun and a huge thrill at a low cost.

Thanks to NTCA and their commitment and all of you that make this a fun event for us big kids. Do not forget that without the backing of CORSA events like these could not be possible or at least overly expensive due to the insurance required.




