Recently we've accrued \$56.00 in dues, \$20.00 in ad fees, and estimated \$0.11 in dividends as of the end of October. We now \$240.89 in Checking, \$1167.29 in Savings, and our total worth is \$1408.18




Leaves had fallen at the latest Tech N Tune.


LOTS & LOTS OF CORVAIR PARTS!


