Here is quick write up of the November 17th show we attended and texted you the picture from. The show was to benefit the Florida School for the Deaf and Blind in St. Augustine. We had a large turnout - more than 300 cars of all makes and kinds, both foreign and domestic from Model T's to present muscle cars. The weather was fantastic, sunny with a breeze. The club had four Corvairs there, our '65 convertible, a '66 Corsa Turbo convertible, a '66 Stinger, and a '65 Monza coupe. One member tried to bring his Greenbrier but had some issues so ended up bringing his Corvette. The event was run by the local AACA. All cars older than were 1993 were separated into classes by year and make, judged by AACA members, and then presented trophies to the top 3 in each class. The Corvairs were in class 6 which was 1959 to 1968 unmodified GM cars. The member with the '66 Corsa convertible was in class 1 which is the Historical Preservation of Original Features (HPOF) class, the highest judged class as defined by the sporting national club. They gave out only a total of 4 trophies in this class. A DJ played great tunes from the 50's - 80's. They had couple of good food trucks. The spectators seemed a little more informed and were very appreciative that we had brought our Corvairs. When they presented the awards, we received 1st place for our




convertible, 2nd went to the Stinger and 3rd to the Monza coupe. The member who brought the Corvette won a people choice award and the member in the HPOF received one of the four awards in that class - a very high honor! After the show Allison and I and another couple stayed overnight in St. Augustine to enjoy the Nights of Lights in St. Augustine, a top 10 award winning Christmas lights display. Round trip was about 340 miles with no problems and a lot of FUN!!

Also, from Titus, the writeup on the South East Corvair Club Autocross held November eleventh this Fall.

The day started out kind of overcast with a chance of showers. After unloading all the food supplies, Allison and Victoria and Catherine got started on cooking the breakfast and lunch that sold to everyone who comes to the event. I started to get the vehicles that were going to run the autocross teched to make sure there were no mechanical problems. At the same time some other club members were setting up the course and timing equipment. We had a separate little course that the drivers could use to test and tune their cars. We had 26 drivers total. At noon we broke for lunch. As we ate the rains came. We had a couple of squalls pass through, but they eventually moved out and we started our timed runs. There was a couple of places on the course that had significant puddles, but the drivers handled them well. We got through both heats without any more rain and the sun came out during the second heat. There were 4 Corvair powered vehicles that ran along with a Corvette, a couple of Mustangs, a couple of Camaros, a GTO, a new MX-5, a BMW, a Challenger Hellcat, a Neon SRT, a Honda 2000, a Lotus Super-7, and couple of highly modified Datsun 510s. Victoria and Catherine drove their Cruze and Fiesta. They did quite well. They were two of the few that had all 4 clean runs and got faster with every run. A fun day for all


