Corvair Tech Tip— Vehicle Information Kit Submitted by Joe Darinsig The "Restoration kits" are no longer available from GM and have been replaced by an online "Vehicle Information Kit" available at GM Heritage Center website: Go to: https://www.gmheritagecenter.com/gm-heritage-archive/vehicle-informationkits.html select the vehicle and year. Click on the year and agree to the terms. The kit will be downloaded to your computer in a PDF format. The restoration packets are an important and popular free service provided by Chevrolet for those customers seeking *general information* ***about their vehicle and for restoration purposes. Information included in the packets (for most models and years) is: Vehicle highlights, color codes, wheel/tire specs, complete engine specs, transmission, suspension, and other vehicle systems, standard equipment lists, options, trim packages, brake information, vehicle features, exterior/interior dimensions, and engine options. I had obtained the written kit mentioned several years ago for my 1962 wagon.





The resulting publicity in this high profile accident was one of the factors that led to scrutiny of Corvairs and how they handled.







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
