Kitchen Corner

Ambrosia Salad

- 1 (16oz) can jellied cranberry sauce
- 1 (8oz) can pineapple chunks, drained
- 1 (11oz) can mandarin oranges, drained
- 2 cups mini marshmallows
- 1 cup seedless green grapes, cut in half
- 1 red apple, coarsely chopped
- ¼ cup shredded coconut

Slice cranberry sauce in half. Place one half in large serving bowl and beat with fork until smooth. Add remaining ingredients, except coconut, mixing to coat. Cut remaining cranberry sauce into ½” cubes. Gently toss cubes into ambrosia mixture. Top salad with coconut. Can be made up to 6 hours before serving.

Smoky Hobo Dinner

- 5 potatoes, peeled and quartered
- 1 head cabbage, coarsely chopped
- 1 (16oz) pkg baby carrots
- 1 onion, thickly sliced
- salt & pepper to taste
- 1 (16oz) pkg smoked pork sausage, sliced into 2 inch pieces
- ½ cup water

Spray a slow cooker with veg spray. Layer vegetables in slow cooker in order listed, sprinkling each layer with salt & pepper. Place sausage on top of vegetables; pour water into cooker. Cover and cook on low for 6 to 8 hours.

Buckeye Brownies

- 1 pkg brownie mix
- 2 c confectioner sugar
- ½ c plus 6 Tbl softened butter, divided
- 1 (8oz) jar peanut butter
- 1 (6oz) pkg semi sweet chocolate chips

Prepare brownies as directed in a greased 9x13 pan. Let cool. Mix confectioner’s sugar, ½ c butter and peanut butter. Mix well and spread over brownies. Chill for 1 hour. Melt chocolate chips and remaining butter in saucepan. Spread over brownies, let cool & Cut into squares.



TIM'S TECH TIME AND RAMBLIN'S

HELLO AGAIN from the very busy little Corvair Shop in Memphis NY.

WE still ask for material for the Fan each month , knowing what the results will be.. Nobody else has pictures? Or other content for the Fan?

The CORD project continues to haunt me. Trying to install the powertrain , I found out the hard way that carburetors ,oil filter (NOT easy to reinstall!) and starter have to come off to install it. Every inch going up in there was slow and tight! The latest fun is exhaust pipes are not fitting. They hit on steering parts on both sides of the car. These will have to be modified. That should be the last step before lowering the car and working on the top . All carburetors , linkage , fuel lines (custom of course) have to be installed , and then wires hooked up.. To say these cars are NO fun to work on is extremely true.

As a casual observer , I would say this years "Recall" was a very good one! We missed a few of our regular attendees because of situations beyond their control , but a few new smiles showed up . The weather gods smiled upon us favorably when helped make it a very good time. The Cruise in went well also , with nobody getting lost this year.

This month I have a newly rebuilt FC motor for sale. It is run ready to install. New .060 cylinder setup , heads done , new cam (304) and many other extras. The carbs are rebuilt , alternator is Hi output , and much more It is very clean and detailed. ASK me for details and price. It has been run and tuned in for @ 2 hours or more on the test bench.. It is ready to install and drive. It is set up for automatic transmission , including a good converter. I have 2 late model Powerglide transaxles for sale cheap. I have a late turbo block with crank , cam , lifters for sale. It is a dirty bare block , and if it does not sell , I am going to clean it up and build a 110 out of it , which will have the better turbo nitrided crank in it and a 304 cam. I have several other motor cores here to rebuild. My plan is to build the best ones first , and get rid of the rest. Anyone with a late turbo car should be interested in that block setup. I also have some starters all cleaned up , bad parts replaced and bench checked for sale. I even have one 1960-61 (different nose cone). The 1960 motor for parts still sits here waiting for a new home. It is a shame , but if it does not leave here soon , I will have to take it in for scrap. I really need my space back!

The club display motor from Ron's car is on the trailer. I had planned on several upgrades , but the thing started leaking oil already thru a new glued pan gasket. So now it has to get back up in the air enough to REALLY fix it this time. At least it seems to run good. I built new carburetors for it (they were missing) and a late distributor to replace the 1960 one. I got no response asking for ideas on a new cover design , so I will improvise something. Only one person asked the display so far , so it is not top priority.

I have a new portable cooler for the shop to help me work longer on these super heated days. Comfort level only lasted until about 1PM without it. The shop area stays comfortable a long time on hot days when I can keep the doors closed , and do not have to use the Torches.

We plan on being at the Fairhaven show very early to try to get "our spot". They frown on holding spaces , so I hope all of our gang gets there early also. It is much more fun to be together at these shows.

Our personal month of June is extremely busy here with Corvair and Amateur Radio events all month. We are always glad when its over. We have a busy Ham radio event we work at the day after the Fairhaven show , then I hope things space out better.




