June was a fairly slow month for club activity. We held a tech session at George's Rush facility. At the session, we worked on George's 64 convertible to service the fuel sending unit. After that, we put my 66 coupe on the lift and adjusted the clutch cable.

June 16th, 2018 ACORN Tech Session hosted by the RR&PC

This tech session involved replacing the gas gauge sending unit in George's Monza and checking the malfunctioning driver's side stop/tail light. The other task was to adjust the clutch on Paul's Monza and install a quick shift kit. Unfortunately, I forgot to take photos of the activities. I apologize.

George's Monza, Part I

The gas gauge was not working so it was thought that the sending unit was faulty. George had ordered a new one, and it went in without a problem. However, the gauge was still reading over the "F" mark while we knew that the tank was well below that amount, i.e. empty. I didn't bring the fuel gauge test procedure and couldn't remember the steps. To confirm that the new sending unit wasn't faulty, we took it out of the tank and rigged up a taillight bulb with a few pieces of wire to a battery and operated the float [an ohmmeter wasn't available]. After a few sparks caused by multiple hands holding loose wire ends, it was determined that the unit was okay. We reinstalled it and called it a day for the gas gauge. Further diagnosis was needed.

A typical problem with early models, the taillight unit appeared to have a poor ground. Jiggle the bulb, and it would light. After taking out the housing and checking the bulb, it still wouldn't work properly. George said that he would correct it later.

Paul's Monza

First we adjusted the clutch at the clutch rod after we thought about which way to turn the swivel to properly position the clutch pedal. Without having looked it up beforehand, it's a bit tricky to imagine which way the rod would move when pushing the pedal, thanks to the cross shaft. At any rate we got it done. [I mean, how hard could it be to turn the swivel the other direction if one direction was "wrong?" Not hard at all, we found.]

We started to look at the quick shift kit but found that one of the two setscrews that hold the shift lever extension on to the lever was missing. Paul will pick up another screw, and we'll schedule the installation for a later date.

Tech Session Continued...

George's Monza, Part II

I went over to George's house a few days after the tech session to troubleshoot the gas gauge problem. I brought the sending unit and gauge testing procedures as well as an ohmmeter and shop manuals. George had loosened the instrument cluster so it could be pulled out several inches so we could see the wiring.

We started with the tests that were supposed to either move the gauge needle to "F" or to "E." It stayed on "F." After looking at the wiring, I noticed that there were a number of extra instrument panel illumination bulbs and several connectors hanging loose. George said that the car had a Spyder instrument cluster at one time. We started testing for continuity of the wire from the sending unit to the gauge. Nothing. The wire from the sending unit was tan; the two wires on the gauge were black. However, there was a connector hanging loose that had a tan wire. We put the ohmmeter on it and found that that was the gas gauge wiring. Both connectors were of the same configuration. George said that at one time, a shop he uses was doing some work behind the instrument cluster. Apparently, the shop plugged the wrong connector on to the gas gauge. I think it was for the Spyder tach. So, if you need a sending unit, George has a good used one he might sell!

George had already fixed the tail/stop light by the time I arrived. All's well that ends well.

July 2018 Treasurers Report...

Once all of the 2018 dues were deposited, we had a grand total of \$520.70 in the Treasury. Current paid up headcount in the club is now 30 families.

To purchase large totes to queue the materials donated from the Bartasevich stash to the Rush ACORN stash we spent \$60. We spent \$20 to cover coffee and donuts for the June Tech Session held at the RR&P Facility. Current balance in the Treasury is \$440.70.

A potential future income source could be from the white elephant sale at the August annual picnic, presuming someone volunteers to host that event. Likely income outflows will be the coffee and donuts at tech sessions and the usual stipend the club offers to those attending the November annual dinner meeting.

We usually end the year with just a couple bucks left in the till.

Vent window assy: 2 for early convertible **"Grille bars":** 2 - '60; not in great shape


