TREASURER'S REPORT

In December 2018 we collected \$65.00 in dues. We also collected \$132.21 from members as their portion of dinner at our Christmas Holiday Party at the Prohibition Gastro Pub. For our dinner we paid \$125.00 cash plus \$171.26 on Dave McChesney's card. We also covered our offer to pay the first \$15.00 of every meal by returning one couple's check for dues in the amount of \$30.00. We transferred \$200.00 from savings to checking and reimbursed Dave the \$171.26. We also deposited \$42.21 to checking. Since the last report we added another 10ϕ in dividends to our savings. We now have \$150.25 in checking, \$918.66 in Savings, and a Grand Total of \$1068.91 in the account.






