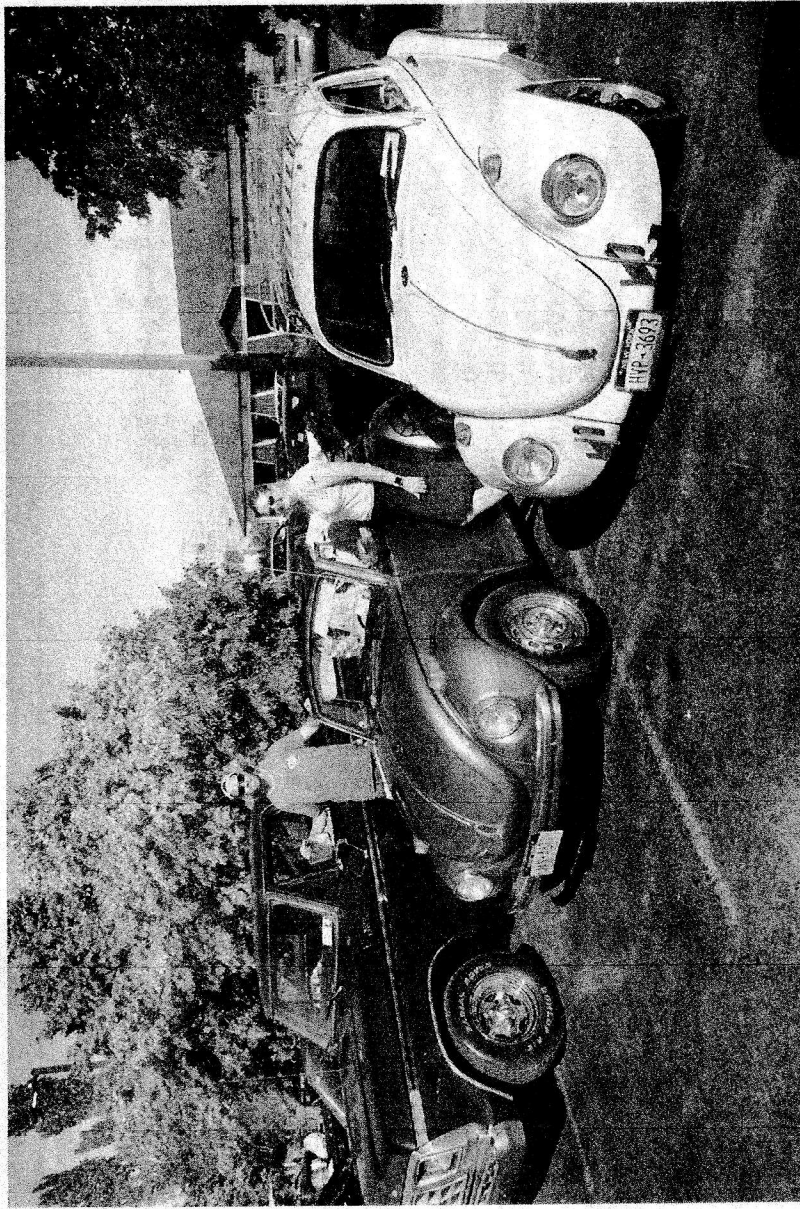

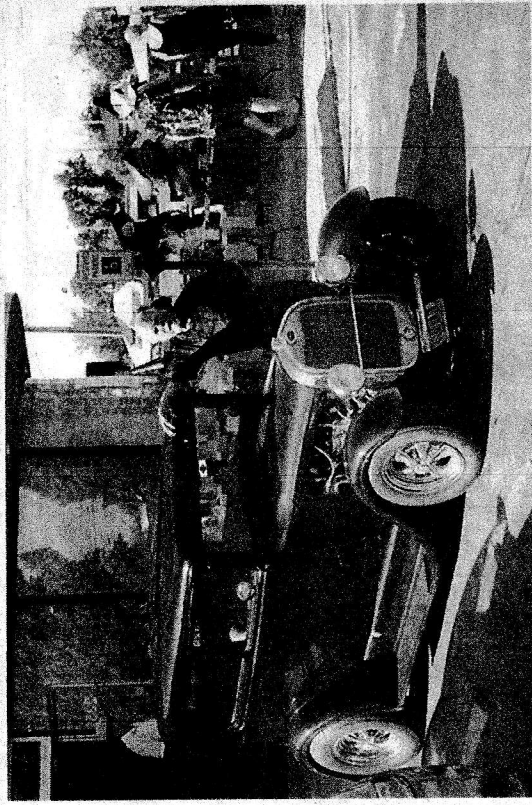

The Crohn's & Colitis Foundation is a non-profit organization dedicated to finding a cure for Crohn's disease and ulcerative colitis.

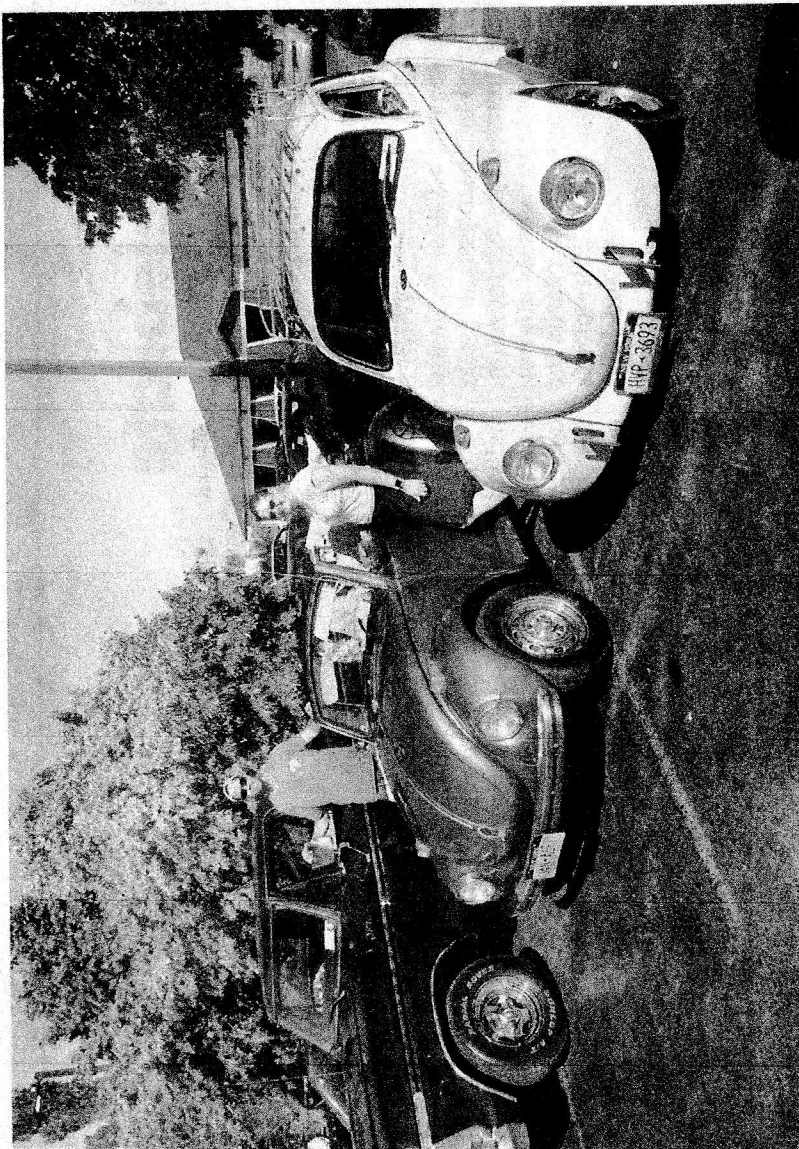

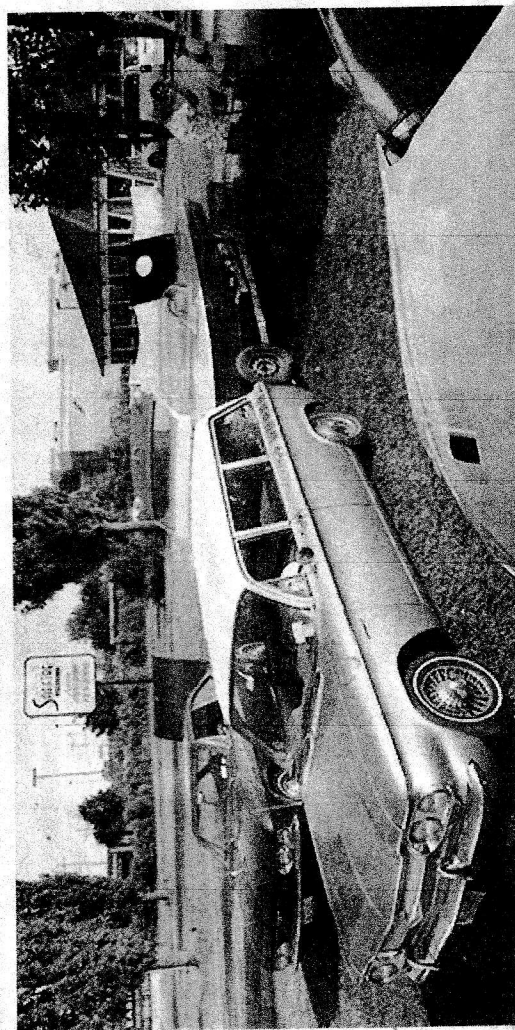

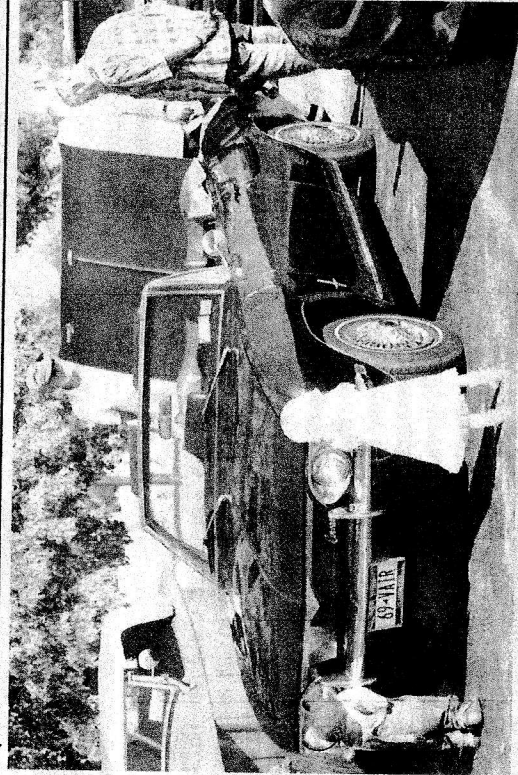
