In the past month we've gained \$50.00 in dues, thanks to a member who has paid ahead a considerable bit and an estimated 10¢ in dividends at the end of September. We just sent a check to CORSA for \$35.00 to cover our annual Chapter filing and registration fee. We now have \$304.25 in checking, \$1119.43 in Savings, for a Grand Total of \$1423.68. (Did anyone catch the typo in last month's Treasurer's Report which indicated a grand total of about ten times more than it was? Your editor's editing must have been off, because it wasn't seen until writing up the current report.)

We now show six members owing dues, with one becoming due in November. Membership is \$15.00 per year. CORSA members pay \$13.00. We also show one vendor owing the \$20.00 ad fee.





OF INTEREST


