of them were beyond help and were just good for parts. We advised her of which cars to let go of and which ones had more value due to special options or perhaps were in better condition than others. There was one potential buyer who offered a set price for every Corvair in the vard. As time went on and the value of scrap steel plummeted that buyer vanished. Some of the cars were dragged out of the grass and a few of the better ones that were stored inside the barn were sold off. I personally bought a white 1965 Monza 4-door sedan that had some interesting options. When friends from the Garage Squad met me at the farm on the appointed day we had a heck of a time getting that car out of it's resting spot and onto my trailer. The back of the car didn't want to go away with the front half of the car! It nearly ripped itself in two!! We did eventually prevail and the car went up to Pete's cousin's shop in Swartz Creek. After disassembly I think we got about \$44 for the gutted carcass.

Interestingly some of the cars that were sold off showed up on Facebook Marketplace soon after they left the farm. Hopefully they will be put to good use once again. But our next challenge was what was left inside the barn. There were still a few Corvairs in one of the metal sheds. Their exit was blocked by a 1969 Monza coupe that Harold was working on. All of the rear suspension and powertrain have been removed making the car somewhat difficult to move out of the way so the pair of Loadside trucks and a 1953 Chevy sedan that reportedly was bought new by Harold back in 1953 could escape. Inside the big barn we found a pair of Chevy Jr. go-karts, one complete and one just the fiberglass body. I was able to purchase both and my son, Paul has been able to get the complete one up and running. He is working on fixing the other one with a bigger engine and a replacement chassis that we found on Craigslist.

What we found up in the second story hay loft is another story all together. It will take several visits and lots of energy to get everything down on ground level and then find a way to get these bits and pieces back into the hobby. The Garage Squad has signed up for this duty to help the surviving family and to honor our friend and former member Harold Dexter. Any inquires as to availability of these parts should be directed my way so we can coordinate with the family and not interfere with their daily lives. We need to be considerate and take it slow.

The other parts bonanza that the Garage Squad engaged in this month was the Fall Classic at Clark's...in Fraser! The first and last version of this event was held on October 12th at Clark Hartzel's place. In Fraser. It looked like rain. It WAS rain! But it cleared up a bit and we had fun. Chef Paul brought a gas grill and he prepared vittles for everyone. We had a reasonable turn out.

. Many good deals were had. At the end of the day the Squad helped pick up and put back in the tent whatever parts didn't sell. A follow up visit was made just last night and a deal was struck to totally clean out the parts collection. Tomorrow myself and Garage Squad member Gary K will go back to Fraser and finish the clean out. Clark still has his T Bucket project and it does use some Corvair parts.
