



Joe Darinsig's 1966 Yenko **Stinger Corvair YS-313**

I purchased this car in June 2002 in Pennsylvania. Don Yenko built the Stingers at his dealership in Cannonsburg, Pa. He made a deal with Chevrolet to purchase 100 Corsa coupes all Ermine white with black interior, 4 speed trans..4

carburetor engines rated at 140hp. There were trucked in and parked in a field behind the dealership. They were converted to the Stinger theme there. Don and some race friends figured the Corvair would be a great contender for the SCCA D/ Production road

ship in D/P.



He later built 25 1967 Corvairs and they were painted red or blue with white stripes and accents. They were numbered YS-101 to YS-125. There were no YS-200 tags used. Later also he built cars or converted owners Corvairs that used the YS-300 to YS-320. My Stinger was a later built version that has my YS-313 tag on it. There only 186 Stingers ever built, making them a RARE breed of cars !! Most of the original 100 cars were sold for road racing, only a small percentage were sold in street trim.



Body Shop in York, where I live. We worked nights and weekends on it. It was primered, base coat in white and two coats of Ermine white, blue stripes and accents. Two coats of clear and many hours of buffing. Body work was done by Kurt Jones, panting by Jesus Lopez and engine by Dan Heckel. Two year ago I added the original English Minilite wheels, all aluminum and very light, At

many shows I usually have to explain the story about the Stinger history. You just don't see them around and the peo ple who have one do not sell them. The car has one many awards which adds to the enjoyment and fun of displaying it. Looking forward to the upcoming car show seaso





Why the Chevrolet Corvair Corsa Is Collectable

It seems you can't mention the Chevrolet Corvair without mentioning Mr. Ralph Nader. Yes, his consumer safety campaign effectively killed the car and yes, there was nothing fundamentally wrong

with the car. So, now that we've mentioned him, let's move on and discuss the Corvair. Simply put, it was revolutionary for an American car in that era.

Detroit effectively had one kind of car in the early sixties, the kind that was so massive it generated its own gravitational field. But the Corvair was conceived to compete with the silly, little imports that some confused Americans were intent on buying. Not only that, but the engine was rear-mounted allowing a completely flat floor pan and an improved interior package. Introduced in 1960 to an eager public, the Corvair soldiered on through 1969 facing stiff competition from all of GM's rivals as well as some of General Motors own products (such as the Camaro). And none of those cars had any negative press surrounding them.

But whether you believe that the criticism was warranted or that people simply didn't know how to safely operate a rear-engined car with a swing-axle suspension there was one special edition particularly worth noting: the Corvair Corsa. It debuted as a special edition when the second generation Corvair bowed, in 1965. The base Corvair had a 95hp powerplant and there was an optional 110hp engine too. But the Corsa was fitted with a 140hp engine (with four single barrel carbs). If this *still* wasn't enough, Chevy offered an optional 180hp (!) turbocharged mill. And there was also an optional four-speed manual transmission when the turbocharged engine was selected.

As an aside, the Corvair has more in common with the Porsche 911 than many people know. Besides sharing a basic rear-engine, rear-wheel drive architecture, they were both powered by a flat-six engine and had a swing-axle suspension in the rear (the Corvair eventually shifted to an independent rear). In fact, the Corvair was frequently marketed and reviewed as the 'Poor-man's Porsche' (despite initially having two extra cylinders).

Not only could the Corsa pack 180hp, but it also included larger brakes borrowed from the Chevelle, a stronger differential ring gear, a Delcotron alternator (replacing the generator), and significant chassis refinements were made. In addition, a Special Purpose Chassis Equipment ("Z17") handling package, consisting of a special performance suspension and quick ratio steering box, was an interesting new option for 1965.

Sadly, the Corsa was short-lived, remaining in production for only two years. But a relatively short production run coupled with the most powerful engine for the model means that it is the most collectable model and will easily remain so.

KILLED BY THE CAMARO

The Corvair Corsa lasted only two short years, but in that time it won accolades for its great driving dynamics in the face of competitors like the Ford Mustang and the Plymouth Barracuda. It was the first American car with a monocoque chassis. Plus, it had full independent suspension like a sophisticated European car. Sadly, when the far more in-your-face Camaro



The Philadelphia Flyers announced today plans to grant the ultimate Flyers wish to 15-year-old cancer patient, Blake Steigauf. In partnership with Make-A-Wish® Philadelphia, Delaware & Susquehanna Valley, the organization will roll out the orange carpet for an

unforgettable Flyers experience including Blake meeting his favorite player, Claude Giroux, signing a one-day contract, and suiting up for a professional game night.

Blake, who was diagnosed with cancer on April 24, 2019, hails from Litiz, Pa. and currently plays for the Manheim Central High School hockey team. A longtime Flyers fan, he wished for the full Flyers experience: attend a practice and a game, visit the team's locker room, eat lunch with the team, meet Claude Giroux and Gritty, and get some practice time in on the ice with some of the players. Blake will not only get to meet Giroux and the rest of the team, including Gritty, but will be surprised with two full days of

professional player-level treatment at a practice and Wells Fargo Center home game.

Blake skated with the Flyers during team practice on Thursday, February 27, had lunch with team captain Claude Giroux. He then suited up in his own dedicated practice stall, complete with name plate and jersey, inside the team locker room and took to the ice at Virtua Center Skate Zone at Voorhees for a skills



practice alongside Giroux and other members of the team.

Following practice, Flyers General Manager, Chuck Fletcher, presented Blake with a one-day contract to join the roster for the February 28 game against the New York Rangers.

Blake's game-day experience will mirror that of his new official teammates, arriving at the arena through the private player's entrance, dressing in an official locker room stall, and lining up alongside the team in the player tunnel. Sure to be a once-in-a-lifetime moment, Blake will lead the team out of the tunnel onto the ice and take an official solo "rookie lap" around Wells Fargo Center ice before watching warmups from the team bench.

As his final game-night duty, Head Coach Alain Vigneault has requested that Blake present the night's starting lineup before he returns to the ice and stands side-by-side with the starters on the blue line during the singing of the National Anthem.
