
Tech Tip: Cleaning Fuse Box Connections

Recently I had an issue where I lost brake and taillights, dash lights and courtesy lights on my '65 Corsa convertible. Troubleshooting, I found no power to the brake light switch at the pedal. I worked backward to the fuse box and found intermittent power at the 10A Tail, Stop, Dome Lamp fuse.

The clips holding the fuse in place were corroded making a poor connection and needed to be cleaned. Before starting the cleaning I disconnected the negative battery cable. To clean the clips I used a thick foam emery board. It fits well between the clips, is sturdy and flexible enough to work the angles necessary without breaking, and the underlying foam has some give, allowing the abrasive outer layer to follow the inside curve of the clip.

I cut the round end off the emery board making it square to better fit in the clip. It is a bit tedious cleaning each side of the clip separately, at both top and bottom, but the emery board works well. Once finished,a can of compressed air was used to blow the dust from the fuse clips. I reinstalled the 10A fuse and reconnected the negative battery cable, and had working lights again!



Over decades rust invades our Corvairs, including the contacts in the fuse box. Might not hurt to check the contacts and clean them before problems occur.

Getting the '64 Road Ready

Mark Stever is working two jobs but still finds time to work on his '64 Corvair Monza with his helpers Alex, Bill and Theo. First project was connecting the dash panel to the new wiring harness Bill Smith put in. After chasing down a few strays it is done.

ABOVE: Jim Dallas brought his barn find '61 Rampside to the meeting. The Rampside was later sold to Kansas City Gary More who drove it for years.




Terry Kalp arrived in this bright red '62 700 4-door sedan. It had been purchased from MCCA member Art Chandler. It is still in Terry's collection.

BELOW: Mel Horstman drove his recently restored Monza to the meeting. An interesting option on this convertible was the factory air conditioning.






To adapt the Alero seats to a Corvair a portion of the front seat rail needs to be bent 90 degrees and a hole drilled in the proper spot.

Bucket Seat Swap

A few months ago Terry Kalp called me and said he had a moral dilemma. He had traded for some bucket seats that were close to what he wanted for one of his projects, but he knew a guy, that might need them and invited me to look at them.

I did.... My jaw dropped....
They were the exact match for the worn Olds Alero seats I had in my '66 Corsa convertible. Exact might even be an understatement, as they are in better shape than the ones I took out of my Alero before I sold it. The old ones have over 100,000 miles on them between the Alero and the Corvair.

The new ones looked new. Only the driver's seat on each set were powered. I thought I might be able to put the old driver's side electric base on the passenger side, but the factory assembly of the seat clearly has the leather on last, and I decided dismantling had too many opportunities to ruin a seat. So it is electric adjust only on drivers side. Since all the seat controls are on the seat it is easy to keep the power seat feature by just running a fused hot wire to the seat.

For those of you who might want to consider a similar switch, I think most GM mid size car bucket seats from about 1995 to 2005 have a similar base and adapting them to a Corvair is relatively simple. Bend the front tangs, 90 degrees and drill a hole to match




The "new" Alero seats perk up the interior of Larry Lee's Corsa.

where you need it for the Corvair. Then decide whether you want a new hole in the Corvair or an off center hole in the new seat base for the rear. Fish a wire to the seat area and power it up.


