

# **The Preventive Maintenance Series**

## '61-'65 4 Speed Transmission Quick Check Part 2

Part one of this two part article addressed a very common issue with '61-'65 4 speed transmissions; the worn countershaft which makes a whine in the lower gears and which can be checked with the transmission off of the differential. This article addresses two common issues that you can check with the side cover off of the transmission.

First thing is to use a flashlight to inspect everything as much as possible looking for major damage. Use a thin magnet to check the sump area for tell-tale debris.



With the two shift forks in neutral, you can inspect second and third gear spur gear teeth and blocker ring clearance. Shift in to third and then into second and you inspect fourth and first gear teeth and blocker ring clearance alternately.



Use a feeler gauge to measure between the blocker ring and the spur gear ledge, holding the blocker ring against the gear while you measure. You need a minimum of 0.030 for used parts. New clearance is around 0.050.



The above picture shows a new blocker ring with a 0.051 clearance.



This picture shows a well worn blocker ring with a 0.025 clearance on the same gear.




This picture shows spur gear teeth that have been flattened somewhat on their points due to worn out blocker rings and/or a driver missing hard shifts. This gear would work reasonable well if you used a new blocker ring but will continue to promote gear grinding with a badly worn blocker ring.

With a very thin cut off wheel or tiny grinding tool, and a steady hand you can cut points back on the spur gear teeth but you would have to use a new blocker ring since you are creating more clearance for the synchronizer sleeve to cross. Note: The larger gears on the '66-'69 transmission are much easier to address in this manner.
