Project Police . . .

Bob Ferenc has installed a new parade boot on his Spyder convertible. He has also been fighting a braking balance problem. He discovered the notches for the parking brake bar in his new brake shoes were not deep enough to let the shoes seat on the anchor bolt. Modifications to the brake bar solved the problem.

Bill Smith is working on his '68. Front bucket seats have been installed. Swapping the exhaust system to dual Harley Davidson mufflers resulted in three broken exhaust studs. Terry Kalp helped Bill extract the broken studs. All the upper engine tin has been blasted and painted along with the valve covers. Bill has been resealing the engine. New gaskets for the oil cooler and adapter, plus top cover gasket replacement. A new rear seal was installed with a fresh harmonic balancer. Push rod tube seals are next.
