During the marathon Ned replaced the rear motor mount, cut out several rusted sections of the passenger floor and made patches for Terry to weld in. Then the car was put on the lift to repair the PowerGlide shift cable and splice back together some wires that got nipped when he was cutting out the rusty floorboard.
