



THE EDITOR'S DESK By Dave McChesney



As it usually is, the "desk" is a mess. It's probably a good thing that Craig comes up with those imaginative pictures of it. Scenes of the real one would no doubt cause everyone to wonder just how in the world does the REAR ENGINE REVIEW ever make it into the world.


I'm starting on this issue a little earlier in the cycle. Right now it's my goal to have it out and on its way to you by the first week end of April. Then for May, I'll try to get on track with the schedule I outline last time. Ideally from then on, all issues will be out by the first of the month for which they are dated.

It hasn't been brought up lately, but I do welcome inputs for the newsletter. The "Craig and Dave" writing, editorial, and printing, establishment seems to do okay, but the RER would do much better with a variety of submitters.

I'm glad to hear we will be doing next year's ECONO-RUN NORTHWEST. I think it will do

wonders for the club, make us a lot more active, and help us reclaim our spot amongst the region's other Corvair Clubs. From the two previous times that I remember the group hosting the ECONO-RUN, here are a few things we should be thinking about. (I think one effect of doing the event will be more frequent meetings/get together to plan it.)

HOST HOTEL: Even though we plan to do this in conjunction with the Cruise and Car Show at next year's CAR d' LANE. I believe we will have to have a "host hotel." Those attendees from afar will want to have a place to stay. It could also be a meeting point for those of us in the local area so we can gather and then head in for the cruise or the car show. Ideally, the host hotel should also contain or be near our chosen banquet site. In the event that any ECONO-RUN participants partake of too many potent potables, it's better that they can walk (crawl, stumble) to their temporary abode, rather than getting behind the wheel. (Insert comment about "loose nut..." here.) It might even be advantageous for those of us in the local area to book a room as well.



LOGO: The artistic amongst us might want to be thinking of a "logo" for the event. Normally it would be an adaptation of the club logo, or something Corvair related.

HARDWARE: This refers to dash plaques, trophies, cups, mugs, t-shirts, or what have you that we might decide to have available to ECONO-RUN participants. These items feature the event logo mentioned above. We'll need to find a place (or places) where we can have this stuff made.

DOOR PRIZES: We need to canvas retailers in the area for donations to the door prize collection. Corvair Vendors are usually willing to donate something as well. In the past it has worked out that everybody at the banquet has gotten at least one prize.

BANQUET: As noted under "host hotel," the banquet site should be at that hotel or nearby. Areas to consider in selecting a place for the banquet include: served or buffet, menu choices,

and cost.

EMCEE: I believe it makes for a more entertaining evening if we have someone fairly adept at public speaking announce the event's prize winners, and conduct the door prize drawings.

ENTRY FORM & FEE: The amount of the entry fee will need to be determined and an appropriate entry form made up. It will need to be available to all potential participants well in advance of the event. (As we are planning to do this in conjunction with the Car D' Lane events, do we contact them as to whether or not we can collect their registration fees and mass register all our ECONO-RUN participants?)

COMPETITION: The ECONO-RUN itself! Do we follow the traditional ECON0-RUN NORTHWEST format and do the mileage competition on the honor system, with participants obtaining gas mileage on the way to the event? Or do we set up a route and have everyone drive it once they have arrived? Do we stick with the traditional six classes that have always been used for the mileage competition? Again, since we plan to do this in conjunction with the Car D' Lane event, we will need to look at just how we do the "car show/people's choice" part of the competition. Do we stay with the usual four divisions plus a "best of show?" Do we keep the balloting amongst ourselves, or do we ask that other Car D' Lane attendees also vote? And will organizers of that event allow it?

I'm sure I'm forgetting a few things. Heck, I could be forgetting a lot of stuff about hosting an ECONO-RUN. But for those of you who have never participated in or helped put one (or a similar event) on, I hope you get an idea of what it takes to host one. (Quite naturally, with new faces and new ideas in the club, we may approach some things in different ways than we did before.)

The big key to doing this smoothly and successfully is to have everyone involved. If so, everyone can feel they have contributed to it, and yet no one need feel like they did it all.
