

Getting the COVID Vaccine in PA

Pennsylvania has started to vaccinate against COVID-19 and is working to expand eligibility to more groups of people. Supplies are extremely limited, so we must prioritize who gets vaccinated first — starting with those most at risk of catching COVID and experiencing complications.

Use this guide to see if you are currently eligible for a COVID vaccine and to find out how to get one. If you have questions about the vaccination process in Pennsylvania, please call the Pennsylvania Department of Health hotline at 1-877-724-3258.

STEP 1: CHECK TO SEE IF YOU'RE ELIGIBLE

With initial supplies limited, the COVID-19 vaccine is being given to those most at-risk of illness — such as older adults, health care workers and Pennsylvanians living in long-term care facilities, and people with certain pre-existing conditions. Learn more about vaccination phases.

Use the quiz online to see if you are currently eligible to get vaccinated.

If you're eligible now, keep scrolling on to Step 2 on the website. If you're not yet eligible, keep checking back. We will update this guide when more phases are eligible.

STEP 2: FIND A VACCINE PROVIDER


Once you are part of a group that is eligible for vaccination, use the map online to find a place to schedule your vaccine. Vaccination providers can include hospitals, urgent care centers, doctor's offices, and pharmacies. Providers have to be registered to receive the vaccine — so make sure your chosen provider is listed on our map before continuing to Step 3. The map is updated Mondays, Wednesdays, and Fridays. All information is self-reported by providers themselves. Note: Philadelphia County is a separate vaccine jurisdiction and has its own information about vaccine distribution.

STEP 3: CONTACT A PROVIDER TO SCHEDULE AN APPOINTMENT

Contact the vaccination provider of your choice directly from the map above to schedule an appointment for your vaccine. When you get the vaccine, you and the person administering the vaccine will both need to wear masks that cover your nose and mouth.

You will receive a vaccination card that tells you which COVID-19 vaccine you received, the date you received it, and where you received it. The card also will remind you to return for a second dose.

Mechanical Fuel Pump Issues: Never Ending?

Fuel pump manufacturers have struggled with Corvair pumps for decades, with loose valves and leaking gaskets becoming revolving issues. This time there is something new with the regular Airtex pumps, both branded and re-boxed units. In addition, I can report on another brand of pump that is being offered for sale.

Issue One:

Many of the Airtex fuel pump boxes over the past few years have a red card inside telling you to tighten the screws before installation. That would be a good idea if their engineers had designed reasonable fasteners. The screw heads were changed on different production dates (the most recent screw used is a 5/16 hex) and with that change, the length of the screw was shortened causing the potential problems.

As can be seen in the picture below, the pump on the right has an issue with short fasteners.





- The screws on the right pump are shorter.
- The protruding screws on the left pump are missing 1 1/2 threads; the same was true for the screws on the right pump when they were removed.
- The aluminum casting has only 1/4" of threaded depth.

In the second picture above you can clearly see the number of threads that are not utilized by the screws and with the tapered end missing threads, you have the scenario that failure is probable during tightening. Heat cycles might cause pulled threads also.

Pictured to the right is a replacement screw you could utilize to correct a problem in damaged holes or as a preventive measure in undamaged holes. The left screw is an Airtex original.

The screws I used are 10-24 by 2" and are slightly larger with deeper threads than the original 10-32 screws so they cut their own threads into the stripped holes. Any screws in stripped holes should have a nut and lock washer added to the bottom and I also added a lock washer under the head when I installed them one at a time into undamaged holes. They seated into the original 10-32 threaded holes and held

the torque I felt was necessary. The extra length of the screws will clear without cutting them off if you were replacing screws without removing the pump. Issue Two:

There is a new mechanical fuel pump being marketed by US Motor Works: USMPo9970. The cost is \$53 plus shipping. It is manufactured by our Trans-Pacific Trading Partner and the pump I received needed immediate attention before installation

Corvair **Cooks** Corner Merlot Filet Mignon

Prep Time: 20 minutes

INGREDIENTS

- ♦ 2 beef tenderloin steaks (8 ounces each)
- ♦ 3 tablespoons butter, divided
- ♦ 1 tablespoon olive oil
- ♦ 1 cup merlot
- 2 tablespoons heavy whipping cream
- ♦ 1/8 teaspoon salt

DIRECTIONS

- In a small skillet, cook steaks in 1 tablespoon butter and the olive oil over medium heat until meat reaches desired doneness (for medium-rare, a thermometer should read 135°; medium, 140°; medium-well, 145°), 4-6 minutes on each side. Remove and keep warm
- In the same skillet, add wine, stirring to loosen browned bits from pan. Bring to a boil; cook until liquid is reduced to 1/4 cup. Add the cream, salt and remaining butter; bring to a boil. Cook and stir until slightly thickened and butter is melted, 1-2 minutes. Serve with steaks.


Is Your 2021 CPCC Membership

August CPCC Tech Session

On Sunday, August 20th, members of the CPCC met at the garage of Dick Peris for the annual Tech Session.

Dick discussed several topics including problems with the heads for the Corvair. Dick discussed how they are installing late model fan bearings on the early fan housing so that the lighter weight fans can be used on the early engines.



Another topic discussed was about what to do if there is an oil film over the top of the engine and the source can not be detected where it may be coming from. There is a vent tube that fits into the side of the fan housing with the other end being in the top shroud. This tube becomes clogged. All you need to do to fix the problem is to run a flexible piece of metal (like a thin metal rod or a long spring) through the vent tube. The dirt will just remain there with only small pieces of dirt possibly being sucked up to the air cleaner.

We also talked about modifying the clutch pedal shaft. Dick has made a voke which allows it to pivot instead of the clutch cable to pivot and break. . This isn't really a hard modification; the hardest part of this is that on the clutch pedal shaft where the cable attaches there is a sheet metal tab that needs to be removed. There isn't a lot of room to bend this tab. After the tab is removed, using a pair of vice grips to flatten the remains tab and install the new yoke. After doing this, the clutch rods need to be cut off because it will hit the frame and a slight clutch adjustment made.

After the tech session ended the members socialized and discussed more Corvair issues. Dave Steigauf gave several guided tours of his recently restored inferno red 1965 Corsa.



Keith Kahwajy had an audience with his V-8 powered Corvair. He recently repurchased this car and was talking about the overheating problems he had with it in the past. The radiator for the engine is in the engine compartment

where the original engine had been. Evaluation. With a new radiator and with two electric pulling air and one fan pushing air trough the radiator this has solved the over heating problems.

John Berkheimer drove his pretty little 1964 green Spyder convertible for the members to see. The last time I saw this car there wasn't any trim or bumpers on it. This is another car to be proud of. I was using John's car to show a few members some of the items discussed at the national convention during the Stock Corvair Groups

I was showing members how I was repairing the quarter panel window flap. On every car the rubber is torn and out of shape from all of the years of use and quarter panel windows being up.

The replacement that Clark's sell are wrong. I took the ones from my car and cut the rubber flaps off from the back. This left support to glue new rubber to on the front. I used glue called GOOP to cement the new rubber on. The flaps fit flush with the door pillar, so whatever thickness of rubber used in the repair should also be used to make a



as the tapered mounting hole had not been installed in the casting. Overall the PRC pump weighs 17 oz, while the Airtex design weighs 28 oz.

Subsequent testing on a running engine (thanks to Scott) was almost disastrous. The pump immediately pegged my Snap On fuel pump tester (15lbs max) and started leaking profusely around the pushed on hose connection. The original pump we started with produced 7lbs, and as noted in GM manuals, it should be 4.5lbs. And as shown in the pictures below, the pressure spring is taller, has no flattened coils (top & bottom) and some kind of epoxy used to seal the center of the diaphragm was already coming apart.
