Member Spotlight

John & Eloise Goni. 1965 Corsa Turbo owned since 1968

Here's John's story in his own words:

My first recollection of being in a Corvair was when my Dad ordered a '65 Impala Super Sport, and due to some delay in delivery my Dad was given a '65 Monza 140 demonstrator to use until his ordered car was available. I was a senior in high school at the time, and I really enjoyed driving the Monza. (I never imagined some 56 years later I would be driving a '65 Corsa turbo.)



I soon went off to college, and after the first year we bought a second car for the family (a '61 Corvair 500 "business sedan", 80 BHP with Powerglide trans.) which I got to take to college (Cal Poly Pomona-some 400 miles from home). I majored in Civil Engineering (with an effective minor in Mechanical Engineering). Spent a lot of time in the Automotive labs, learning a lot about vehicle and engine design. And learned a lot about car safety and vehicle dynamics in Traffic Engineering classes. A fellow at college had a 1965 Corsa 140, and I realized this was the car of the future for me. In 1968 I found a Sierra Tan '65 Turbo Corsa, which I still have today, 53 years later. Fortunately for me, this Corsa had every performance option available when ordered from the factory (turbo engine, 4 speed trans, Positraction, simulated wood and telescopic steering) plus most of the other options available-unfortunately quick steering and sport suspension were not available yet.


Plus, this Corsa had owner installed quick steering arm and radial tires-Dunlop SP-41's.



This Corsa was my only vehicle until after I graduated from Cal Poly Pomona in 1973, moved to San Luis Obispo, and could afford another vehicle for everyday use. My Corsa has original paint, chrome, and interior (Saddle). I truly believe this is one of the better original Corvairs in the country. At car shows many ask me how I kept my car looking so good for so many years, and I usually reply this car was always covered when not in use and has many many coats of wax put on over the years to protect the paint. And then I would add, how do people get a new car to look so bad after just a few years.

Parts of my car were repaired as needed, but never "restored". Rebuilt the engine in 1974 to factory specs at 90,000 miles, and rebuilt the rear suspension shortly thereafter. Current mileage on the odometer is 117,926. A few improvements were made over the years; Crown front and rear suspension modifications, 14-inch wheels and high- performance tires (which is probably the best improvement I ever made to any vehicle), '66 front "valence panel/spoiler", oil pressure and temp gauges, 3-inch racing style front seat belts with shoulder harnesses, safe guard ignition, and roller rocker

arms. The more I work on my Corsa, the more I realize how much engineering and 'out of the box' thinking went into the Corvair, and what this car could have been had the engineering team been allowed to continue developing the Corvair. A truly remarkable car. And to this day we are still learning about how remarkable this car is.

My brother and mother liked my Corsa so much they went on to own their own Corvairs. My brother Dwayne had several Corvairs, but has sadly moved on to other makes. My mother, Lou Goni, however, had Corvairs to her dying day. She was very active in the San Francisco CORSA chapters, and was also active at the national CORSA Board level, was a Concours judge, helped new chapters get started, helped with a few CORSA national conventions, and many more activities to help CORSA. My mother was very much interested in the social activities of being a CORSA member. I joined for the technical info and help afforded by being a member. Not sure when I joined national CORSA, but I can't remember ever not being a member. I participated in many Central Coast CORSA activities for many years, but finally joined after Jim Pennell kept lobbying me to join and promised we have technical advantages at Central Coast Corsa-which turned out to be very true.
