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ORPHAN CAR TOUR

"A River Runs Through It"



Saturday, June 5, 2021

The **2021 Orphan Car Tour** is scheduled for Saturday, June 5, will follow a 60-mile circuitous path from Burkittsville, Maryland to Bluemont, Virginia. Along the way, participants will have the opportunity to stop and visit a private collection of 25 cars (1908-1970), an operating grist mill, the Harpers Ferry National Historical Park, an antique auto repair and restoration shop, and several other places of interest. Upon arrival at Bluemont, participants will partake in a buffet dinner. The Tour's nickname this year is "A River Runs Through It", because of the route's several river crossings.

This year's tour is a replay of the 2020 tour which was canceled due to the pandemic. The 2021 event is contingent upon the continued improvement of the corona virus situation. That situation will be reviewed by Tour officials in mid-April, and a decision to go ahead or cancel will be made at that time.

This will be the 29th Orphan Car Tour, an event designed to encourage the driving enjoyment of antique "orphan" (discontinued-make) vehicles which are at least 25 years old. Each tour takes place in a different location in the greater Washington-Baltimore area, usually rural, whose low-speed roads are old-car friendly. Participants follow printed directions and travel at their own pace. As many as 64 cars have been driven on past tours, bearing name plates that ranged from the familiar (Pontiac, Mercury, Plymouth) to the obscure (Moline-Knight, Flanders and Alvis). The oldest cars ever driven date back to 1912.

What is the longest trip you have taken in your Corvair?


I drove my '68 coupe from Sykesville, MD to college in Cookeville, TN, but not back. I broke down on the interstate about a mile from college and had to tow it home.

Main Bearing Oil Gallery Modifications

Rebuilding and overhauling Corvair engines over the years, I have noticed a problem that I do not believe has been previously addressed. The main bearing galleries cast into each engine block

half do not always align with each other, or transition properly to the bearing oil hole. I have developed the following procedure to correct this situation.

After separating the crankcase, remove cam, crank, and bearings. Retain one main bearing insert. Mate the engine halves, and note the alignment, or misalignment of bearing Galleries. If misalignment is noted, it should be corrected at this point. You could use the Ball End Mill or a Dremel type tool, with abrasive cutoff type disk. See picture below.

Courtesy Light Problems

I'm fixing up a '68 convertible and it had one courtesy light that sometimes stayed on. I thought I would just buy a new socket, but they are not available except as part of a wiring harness (at about \$50). Time to get to the bottom of this.

All Corvair convertibles and some sedans have two courtesy lights mounted under the dash. One of these was the light giving me the trouble. What is going on? Under dash lights were an option on cars that did not come with them and the dealers had a kit to install them upon request. I had a kit in the basement that I bought years ago at a flea market. Time to use it! The bulb was a bit tarnished from sitting on

a shelf for 50 years so I thought I would just use a new one. That's when I found out what was causing the problem. The short version of what I found is "They don't make them like they used to."

This is a new socket with bulb from that kit. And my old socket. Notice the way the bulb fits the new one and how the old one is broken out. Why? It turns out the original bulb (left) is flat on the end and the replacement (right) is



pointed. That makes the bulb too long to fit into the socket and so if you force it (which is not hard to do) the socket breaks. Oops. I have looked and cannot find type 89 or 1155 (rough service version of 89) with the shorter end. The bulb that came with the kit fits fine. If it burns out I guess I will try to file down the end of *the new* bulbs and hope it does not break the bulb. I am writing this article mostly

Hot Crab Dip

Taken from Merchandiser "Your 2020 Community Recipe Collection"

INGREDIENTS:

1 (8 oz) Pkg Cream Cheese

1/2 cup Sour Cream

2 T. Mayonnaise

1 T. Lemon Juice

1 1/4 t. Worcestershire Sauce

1/2 t. Dry Mustard

1/4 t. Garlic Salt

1/2 c. Whole Milk

2 T. Grated Cheddar Cheese (from 8 oz. pkg.—saving the rest)

1 lb. Crab Meat

INSTRUCTIONS:

Mix first seven ingredients until smooth. Add enough milk until mixture is creamy enough for dipping. Stir in 2 T. of grated cheese, then add crab meat and mix gently. Pour into a greased 1 1/2 qt. casserole bowl and top with the remaining grated cheese. Bake until bubbly and brown at 375° for 20 minutes. Serve hot with your choice of crackers.

A Unique Way to Install Speakers in a Late Model

I am fixing up a '68 convertible and would like to install air conditioning someday. I am not ready for that project, but thought I should install the Air Conditioning vents while I had the



dash out to fix some rust. I bought the template for the dash vent cutout from Clark's and the vents from a Camaro supplier.
Reproduced '68 Camaro vents are almost identical to the not reproduced Corvair vents. The installation went pretty well and this is what they look like installed.

I looked at the vents and thought why not put speakers there? The A/C air hoses are 3" and I have some 3" speakers. Well, the hoses are 3" but the inside diameter of the A/C vent is 2 ¾ inches. As far as I can tell, no one makes a 2 ¾ inch speaker. The next smaller size is 2"- tiny! give up on my project!



smaller size is 2"- tiny! Not ideal for sound but I didn't want to

So how to mount the speakers? I took a 1" thick scrap of wood and cut out a 2 %" circle with a hole saw. Then I cut out the middle of that piece with a 2" hole saw and ended up with this "donut".

I then fastened the speaker to the wooden ring and pushed the ring into the end of the A/C vent. It fit so well I didn't need to use any glue or screws to hold it in. This was a test shot using an old vent to test the fit.



then used new Camaro vents in the car, which you can see in the picture.

How does it sound? About as good as the built-in speakers on a flat screen TV. I will call it OK but not great. However, I also have the Clark's stereo speaker (2 speakers on one board) mounted in the stock speaker position and two speakers behind the rear seat, so between the 6 of them, it sounds fine and having the sound come from all across the dash sounds much better than just coming from the center. Besides, it was a fun project just to see if it could be done.

Next, I will put in a subwoofer, which actually is pretty easy on a convertible. There is a surprising amount of room behind the rear seat cushion. But that will be a story for another day.



to warn you that if you have to replace one of these bulbs, be careful! If the new bulb does not go in easily, be careful that you do not break the socket. They are rare and expensive!

And why does the light stay on if the socket is broken? Shouldn't it be off? The courtesy lights work by being grounded by the door switch. The broken socket lets the bulb slip out a little bit and the bulb grounds on the metal bracket holding the socket and the light stays on.

If anyone knows where to get the shorter end bulbs or new sockets at a reasonable price, please send an to me at william.garrison1@gmail.com. I suspect I will be needing to replace a few more as the years go on.
