

North on Hwy 2 (N. Newport Highway)
Left (west) on E. Colbert Rd. (First left after
CAT TALES ZOOLOGICAL PARK)
Left (south) on N. Saddle Hill Rd.
Left (east) on E. Bridle Trail Rd.
Left (north) on N. Summerwood Dr.
Right at the third or last house/driveway prior to
road end.

(Suggested option to Hwy 2)
East or west bound on I-90...
Take Exit 287 and proceed...
North on N. Mullan Rd. (quickly becomes N. Argonne Rd. and farther on, N. Bruce Rd.)
Left (west) on E. Day Mt. Spokane Rd.
Right (north) on Hwy 2 (N. Newport Hwy)
Continue as above to E. Colbert Rd and on.

(Alternate route to E. Colbert Rd.)
North on N. Wall St.
Bear right as it becomes N. Waikiki Rd., N. Mill
Road, and N. Little Spokane Dr.
Right (east) on E. Colbert Rd.
Right (south) on N. Saddle Hill Rd.
Continue as above to E. Bridle Trail Rd and on.

MUSEUM TOUR

10 am on the morning of Sunday the 18th of April saw several Corvairs and a dozen or so members of the Inland Northwest Corvair Club gathered in the parking lot outside The

Historic Flight Foundation at Felts Field. A few minutes after the hour we were told they were ready for us, so we made our way inside, paid our eight dollars apiece donations and began the tour.

The museum has an extensive and impressive collection of aircraft celebrating what it considers to be the Golden Age of Flight. That era began in 1927 when Charles Lindbergh flew the Atlantic solo, and ended post WWII as jet powered aircraft came into their own. As was pointed out by our extremely efficient guide, Lindbergh and the *Spirit of St. Louis* had visited Felts Field as he toured the country following his historic crossing.

Among the collection there are many early commercial or private aircraft. These include rather primitive open cockpit biplanes and some of the earlier enclosed cabin models. Included in the latter is an immaculate Beech Staggerwing.

Also on display are several military aircraft of the pre-war and WWII era. Amongst these are a PT-17 primary trainer, and AT-6 Texan advanced trainer, a B-25 Mitchell bomber, a British Spitfire, a P-51B Mustang, and an F8F-2 Bearcat. The Mustang is rare, being an early razorback version equipped with an optional Malcom hood over the cockpit.




