I use a group 51R battery in my Brier, from NAPA. This battery fits in the battery compartment of all FC's and 61-64 passenger cars. For 1960. a group 51 would work. Difference being location of the terminals.



I've got this great battery carrier (also from NAPA) which can lift this group 51R battery either from the short end, or the long end. Perfect for installation into the recessed battery compartment.





NAPA batteries are made by Johnson Controls which most will agree is the best manufacturer of batteries. I have them in all my cars, and have gotten great service out of them...........Gary
