Brake Bleeding Tip

If you're in a situation where you need to bleed the brakes but don't have a helper to assist, I discovered in the CORSA Tech Guide this simple method to do one-person brake bleeding.

NOTE:
During the
process make
sure the master
cylinder
reservoir always
has a sufficient
supply of brake
fluid, otherwise
you will need
to start over if
it runs dry and
introduces more
air into the
system.

Connect a tire valve




stem extender to the end of the bleeder hose that is connected to the brake bleeder screw on the opposite end. The valve stem extender acts as a one-way valve. Place that end in a jar to collect the brake fluid. Open the bleeder valve and then slowly pump the brake pedal until there is no more air in the system.

Leave the vehicle door open while you pump the pedal and you should be able to hear the air bubbles being expelled into the fluid in the jar. When you don't hear any more bubbles, close the bleeder screw and you're done!

The second resurection was a bit more involved and started early in the day. Sam Fuller's project for the Tuna was a '60 700 that he had purchased from Terry a couple of months ago and left at the Kalp Shop. It was a "ran when parked" project that had set outside, dormant for the past 10 years.

Sam had brought most of what was needed to get the Corvair going. After borrowing a battery from Terry, a fresh gas source and some tweaks of the electrical system, Sam had the 80 hp engine up and running. Next step was to see if it would move under its own power. After several attempts Sam discovered the 700 was literally stuck in a rut. Some air in the tires and a tug from Sam's pickup and the '60 was mobile again.

What seemed like a simple project on Lonene Ackerman's 62 Monza turned out to be rather labor


