Just a simple job.....

Sometimes a simple job can turn into a project, one thing just leads to another.

My intention was to change the trunk weatherstrip on my 62 Corvair. The old one was crumbling, all dried out, and leaking into the trunk. I had a new one from Clark's. I parked the car in front of my garage door, removed the old weatherstrip, wire brushed the channel, and painted the channel with Extend rust converter. Once dry, it took my wife and I about an hour to stuff it in place.

Once done, I went to move the car, and all the car would do is click. Put the battery charger on, and nothing. Bad Starter.

Ok, loosened the air cleaners, shot some starting fluid in the carbs, let it roll downhill and popped the clutch. Now running!

I pulled out the car inside the garage and put the Corvair in. Raised the car in the air on my car lift and pulled out the dead starter.

A closer look, you can see the starter in there. And one of the 2 bolts holding it to the bell housing. The other is above the solenoid. A short 9"16 wrench can get to it. But you have to reach blindly, and find it by feel.

I then, tried some of my used starters with jumper cables until I found one that appeared to work. Put that one in, tried again, and nothing.

I next took 3 starters to Batavia Starter and Alternator and had all 3 rebuilt. I must say I was impressed with his work, all nice, clean, painted, new parts, and each had a tag with the build date of the starter written on it. I put in the starter which had come out of the car, a 1962 starter.

Hooked it all back up and it spun over and started great!

As long as I had the car on the lift, I let it warm up, raised it back up to change the oil.

Well, as soon as I turned the drain plug it came wobbly loose. I ended up pulling out the threads of the oil pan with the plug.

Luckily, I had a few spare pans around, and a new vintage Victor cork pan gasket.

I found a can of Castle Trim Stick which had probably been on the shelf for 30 years, and it still sprayed! Finally my luck was getting better.

So what was supposed to be an hour job ended up being over a week due to things not going as planned. Outside, in front of my other garage door, I have a 66 T-bird, another car with a bad starter blocking access to 2 of my Corvairs. Another project at hand......
