

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Minutes of the Last Meeting

September 2, 2021

The regular meeting started at 7:00. At the prior Board Meeting it was only Josh and I. Not much to go over. When the meeting was opened, we were quickly joined by Don, Dwight, Seth, Jeff, Paul, Rob, and Joe. I don't think I missed anyone.

Treasury Report: No Harry this evening, the back balance as reported last month stands at \$4,505.83. Clark mentioned that we received a \$35 check from Marlene and a short note indicating she enjoyed reading the newsletter. Thanks!

Membership: No new members were reported. By my last count membership stands at 55 plus 4 Honorary. It has about doubled over the past year or so!

Old Business: Seth asked again about in-person meetings. Has anything been dcided. Josh said that he has received 22 responses to his survey. There was a lot of interest in attending meetings but less interest in setting them up. Not surprising. So there has not been a decision yet.

New Business: Seth asked and Get Together and suggested maybe a body shop that worked on Corvairs would be interested. Free advertising. Of course, the thought of Sterling Restorations came up. This seems like a good idea, Josh will check.

Events: Bruce went to Pebble Beach for a classic car auction. The Far Niente winery is one of the sponsors and he gets to go every year. Rough job! He said one Corvair wagon that had been modified "interestingly" went for \$70k! A Porsche 914/6 went for \$700k and a Porsche race car went for \$15 million.

Tech: Paul said he had his seats done from Freddy Dias in Concord. Very good and quick. Looking at an article by Richard Whitman (sp?) he started polishing some chrome pieces. He was pleased

how they came out. He has one piece that has broken, and Bruce said that King of Trim in Pacoima (LA area) could fix it (see https://kingoftrim.com). They can join the metal pieces and re-polish. Paul is having his transmission overhauled. He packed it up in a 5-gal bucket and sent it to Dan Drommerhausen in Torrance, CA. He charges a very reasonable \$165 plus parts and shipping.

Joe has been rebuilding his transmission and showed pictures of his progress. He bought the car so he could learn and wants to do everything himself. Here is a shot with the cover removed.



You can clearly see the brass synchros with the shifting forks out of the way. To get the gears apart, Joe used a puller from



Harbor Freight. It took some finagling, but

he got it apart.

Bruce shared several pics of his blue '69 Corvair coupe before and after going into Sterling Restorations. For paint there are one or two coats of Blue and five coats of Clear. Always use the best quality Clear you can afford r it will yellow and flake off. Bruce also said that Mike Chamorro dropped a valve seat in his Corvair. You may recall it was Mike who drove his Maroon Corvair over to Sterling Restorations so they could match the paint color for Bruce's Corvair. Bruce mentioned that he sold a Blue '66 Turbo Coupe to Eric Vandeburgt. Over the years Eric has collected every Finch Sprint Corvair option and will be putting these on the car and taking it over to Sterling Restorations for painting. Blue with proper Black pin strip-

Jeff replaced the brakes on his '65. This is the first time he has worked on brakes himself. He changed over to a dual-master cylinder setup. He replaced the hoses and lines with new stainless-steel ones from Clark's. It took several tries to get the lines in place (even after removing the gas tank). He found it easiest to start from the very front when inserting the longer lines. Some of the flared ends were not done well and leaked a bit. Especially at the ¼" to 3/16" reducing connector block. He had a hard time bleeding the brakes until he got everything tight. Now it drives great.

On the humous side, when Jeff first got the Corvair he had it trailered over to his house in Blackhawk. His driveway is sloped upwards quite a bit. It was a hot day (104+) and Josh came over to help and they pushed, and pushed and finally got the car off of the trailer. The driveway was so steep they decided to try and zigzag their way up. After what seemed like hours, they had only gotten half way up the driveway and had to quit. Josh said

"so, when you tried to start this car what happened?". Jeff said "Oh we never tried starting it. It's been sitting for a few years." As you can imagine when Jeff got in to start the car it fired right up! Probably should have checked that first.

Jeff said the engine is a 140 but with two secondary carburetors blocked off. He plans to get it running safely and get it painted so he can drive it. He wants to do all of the work himself so he can learn. Right now he is tracking down a load of electrical issues

Josh said that the heads he is having rebuilt are not done yet. The dropped valve seat damage must be welded, and the welder is on vacation. Hopefully these will be done shortly. In the meantime, he put on some 95 heads. The engine runs well until it heats up and then dies. He needs to check the

usual suspects, vacuum leaks and vacuum advance. It has an electric fuel pump so be sure that is working correctly. When it dies, see if the carburetors have fuel. Josh also mentioned that David Gray in Vacaville was rebuilding the engine on a Corvair for an 80+ year old that just wanted to drive the car. To get it painted he will check into Sterling Restorations.

Swap & Sell: When Jeff got his Corvair it came with many extra parts that he doesn't need. Wiring harness, glove box, head light bezels, gear shifter. Need something? Give him a call.

Seth is looking for a late model rear lid. Someone suggested a Pick-N-Pull in Sacramento. Josh said Doris Auto Wreckers in Hayward had a couple of late Corvairs. Seth will check these.

Josh said a lady in Watsonville will be selling her nice late model coupe. It's Red with Black interior with a 140/pg.

Meeting adjourned about 8:50.

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
