Minutes of the Last Meeting

November 4, 2021

Kevin was there selling parts cheap (he sold out in a couple of hours). Christy was also selling parts. On the way home around Santa Clarita Christy stripped an axle yoke and had to rent a truck & trailer to tow the Corvair the rest of the way home. About \$600, yikes!

CCRC will be having their annual Spring Fling again.

Tech: When Evan finally got home after the looong drive from Vancouver, just as he exited the freeway he heard a noise and then a grinding sound. What could it be? Various possibilities were tossed around. Maybe the flywheel is coming apart? Or maybe the harmonic balancer is failing? How about the fan bearing? There are several possibilities. To check the fan bearing, Don says to remove the fan belt at let the engine idle and don't be in a hurry as it can idle without the fan for quite a while. The harmonic balancer is also easy to check. If it is coming apart the outer ring may be contacting the oil filter causing the noise. If need be, Josh said that he had a fan bearing re-greaser that would get him by until a replacement could be ordered.



Christy said that with a flywheel issue the noise would come and go with the clutch. Evan mentioned that he went through lots of oil on the trip down. He added a quart every half tank of gas, 18 quarts in all! He has some serious leaks to attend to.

Josh mentioned that he has picked up several items from Blue Chip Tools in Virginia (bluechipmach.rd@gmail.com). High quality Corvair specialty tools.

Herb is looking for a chrome plating shop in the area. Any suggestions? Josh knows of one in Hayward (High Luster Metal Finishing?) and will email Herb the contact info. Carl mentioned that he had his plastic arm rests chrome plated. He sent them to an outfit in Texas (they advertised in Hemmings).

Carl said he installed seat belts, front and rear. He used the '65 deluxe buckles and '67 retractors as he likes the looks. He ordered rear belts from Clark's but they were too short so he had new ones made locally. He had a hard time finding anyone to sew up the the material which he already had. Liability issues. Paul said he put the rear belts in his '63 Spyder. Ray wants to add them to his '64 and Josh said that the mounting locations were already there starting in '64.


Directions

From San Jose: Take Hwy 680 North to Hwy 580, go West on 580. Take first off ramp (San Ramon Rd). Go North one block. Turn left on Dublin Blvd. Frankie, Johnnie & Luigi Too! is on your left next to the Shell station (you will have to go one block and turn around as there is no left turn into the restaurant).

From Hayward: Take Hwy 580 East and exit on San Ramon Rd (or Foothill). Go left (North) to Dublin Blvd. Follow directions above.

From Stockton: Same as above but head West on 580.

From Walnut Creek: Take Hwy 680 South to Hwy 580, go West on 580. Now follow From San Jose directions...

SFBA Corsa Members Current Projects Paul Beer's '63 Spyder

The interior is all done now. Carpet, gauges, wiring, glove box, glass, weatherstripping, etc...

I started with some sound deadener. It's amazing the difference in the sheet metal before and after, this stuff is thin but makes the floor feel like a bank vault. Should cut the road noise way back. Very easy to install.

Next I cleaned up the dash and gauges. The tachometer was broken so I had Bob's Speedometer in Michi-

gan repair it, they replaced the internals with a modern circuit board. They also repainted the redline.

Now on to installing the carpet from Clark's.

Installing the windshield was next, including gasket and trim. I used the Clark's gasket, which required shaving down the flange that holds the trim in. Used some tape to hold the trim in for installation. I think there may be better alternatives out there for gaskets,

but all in all it went in easier than expected. Coating all the gasket and pinchweld surfaces with Glycerin (vegetable lubricant) really helped.

And finally the interior is done, with seats, panels, hardware, and seatbelts installed. I had Ssnake Oyl Products restore the front belts which came as an option on this '63, and also had them make up rear belts with the same materials (rear belts were a dealer accessory this year).











looked familiar!




