

The History of DACC 1986 by Clark Hartzel

January Aircooler: 1985 Christmas party was at the Rochester Elks Club. The featured car for the meeting was a 1968 coupe from Alabama fixed up by Pete Koehler. The tech session for the evening was Bob Kirkman talking about how GM solved the "thumping" problem that some owners complained about. The main crank bearing was made thicker on one side than the other in effect bending the crank a thousandth out of center. The activity for the January meeting is a movie comparing the Ford Econoline pickup with the Corvair FC pickup. The Ford would actually stand on the front bumper during severe braking tests. Treasurers report \$1,402.05. Ab and Betty lves are bringing coffee and donuts to the meeting and after the meeting we go to Carlos Murphy's restaurant. A tech tip was the rotor in the distributor. 1969 rotor is different and won't work in the earlier models. Use NAPA Echlin RR-1820 for 1962-68. Pontiac and Oldsmobile wanted their own version of the Corvair but Ed Cole talked them out of it. Pontiac came close as they put a Corvair transaxle in the rear with a front 4-cylinder engine. The engine was half of a 389 V8 (slant 4). February Aircooler: A homeowner in Newport News didn't want to pay a junkyard to tow his Corvair away so he buried it in his backyard. The meeting program was a movie borrowed from Larry Claypool comparing the 1961 Chevrolets to other cars of the era. Membership report 107 paid members. The Sloan Museum acquired the Calvair, a Sterling engine car. The engine turned out to be too bulky compared to a normal gas engine. The CORSA national convention will be in Grand Rapids July30-Aug02. March Aircooler: Pete Koehler brought his collection of model Corvairs to the meeting and talked about them. Treasurer's report \$817.50. Results of election of officers: Pres.Stu Shuster, Vice Pres, Clark Hartzel, Secretary: Sharon Pepke, Treasurer: Agnes Surma, Membership: Ken Hand, Editor: Pete Koehler, Activities: Ken Pepke, Parts/Service: Bob Kirkman. A reprint of Chevrolet Service News talks about Engine Fume Odor Diagnosis covering all the places odors come from and how to repair them.

April Airfooler: A picture on the cover of all the new officers. It was mentioned that our April meeting is on April fools day! 61 members attended. Treasurer's report \$831.90. Membership 112. A fun article on the "Pucker" car got a lot of laughs. It is made from the 1946 Lincoln Zephyr and the 1951 Studebaker Starlight with a Corvair powertrain. Stu Shuster did the artwork. Only \$5,000 for the kit. A convoy of DACC members will meet at Briarwood mall April 26th and go to the Tri-State Corvair Club meet in Bryan, Ohio.

May Aircooler: The CORSA national museum display will be at the Sloan Museum May thru October. The cars on display will be the Monza GT, Super Spyder, Astro 1, Electrovair 2, a 1960 sedan, 1964 Rampside, a cutaway turbo charged engine, a fuel injected engine, various photos, drawings and Corvair promo models. Treasurer's report \$583.33. The May meeting will be a film on the 1979 CORSA Convention in Detroit. A tech article on Shock absorbers was presented by Howard Metiva. He listed all the various brands and sizes that would fit Corvair cars and trucks. A great story of buying a 1966 Corvair with air in Arizona by Pete K.

June Aircooler: Pete Koehler wrote an interesting article on picking up a nice Arizona 1960 Corvair for only \$400. How does he do that? It even had a new blue velour interior.

The CORSA/DACC display is now in the Sloan Museum. The May meeting had 76 members.

Treasurer's balance \$747.35. Dr. Jerry Flynn was working in a garage in Ann Arbor and the local Chevy dealer subcontracted Corvair repairs to him as none of their mechanics wanted anything to do with Corvairs. DACC members practiced judging Corvairs at the Sloan Fair so we were ready for the national convention. A nice article in the Aircooler about Kathy Mucha and her artwork and photo restoration service.

July Aircooler: Membership 123, Treasurer's report \$754.79, Kathy Mucha thanked everyone for the happy birthday cake and good wishes. Nice pictures in the Aircooler on the Sloan Museum display. The ribbon was cut by Stu Shuster and skinnier Pete Koehler who just happened to be the CORSA President at the time. Kathy Mucha has planned a fun run in Canada on September 13 and 14. Meet at the Canadian end of the Ambassador bridge. It is truly a mystery tour as nobody but Kathy knows where we are going. Those people who can't make the judging seminar at the Sloan Fair can do it at the next meeting at the Tech Center.

Coming events are the Cass City 4th of July parade, DACC picnic on July 13th and the Historic Fort Wayne show on Aug 24th.

<u>August Aircooler</u>: Cover cutaway picture of the Electrovair. Pete Koehler wrote an article about the trials and tribulations of driving his Corvair Ultravan to Rhode Island and back.

Aug.17th is a corn roast and picnic at John and Carolyn Bryan's house. 14 Corvairs made it to Cass City for the 4th of July parade. A picture of Al Grunert's Corvair powered lawn tractor in Three Rivers. The swap meet there is always fun. Various pictures of some of the cars at the GM Design Staff show on Father's Day. Stu Shuster's 1969 convertible and Pete Koehler's 1966 Fitch Sprint represented DACC. Chuck Jordon showed his 1986 Testarosa which was the first one in the USA.

September Aircooler: Cover picture of the Corvairs and owners attending the Fort Wayne show an article from Pete K. on his list of the perfect 10 Corvairs he wants to own. It was decided to eliminate committee reports at meetings as they are printed in the newsletter. This will give us more time for programs and an early out to the restaurant after the meeting. Not to leave out the nice cars, there will be an award for the nicest Corvair' A two page writeup on Kathy's Canada tour was in the newsletter.

October Aircooler: The joint get together with the West MI Corvair Club is canceled due to their lack of interest. Next meeting will have a video of a Virginia junk yard tour set to music. Pete K gave awards to cleanest car to Cal Brown's marina blue 1966 Corsa and the scab award went to Larry Roger's Corsa with tiny little tires. Membership 135. Treasury at \$1021.53. Pete K wrote an article on his difficulty to find someone to do a wheel alignment on his 1966 Corsa coupe. All the shops said they don't work on Corvairs.
