

Valve Cover Racer Tech Session 2.0

Mike got plenty of two-on-one tutoring as Clark shared his practical experience and I contributed some theoretical opinions. Clark brought his multi-year winning racer and I shared the racers I had built. Mike took plenty of notes and I suspect that his racer may be the fastest at this year's Homecoming. For the benefit of those who are interested, I am attaching CORSA's guidelines for valve cover racers.

Guidelines for Corvair Valve Cover Racing

CORSA provides the following guidelines as a convenience to event organizers and participants. The below rules have been modified to accommodate a "miniconvention" situation, such as the Tri-State. Corvair Valve Cover Racing is similar in concept to the commonly known "Pinewood Derby," utilizing gravitypower racers competing in head-to-head eliminations on a

Racer Specifications:

Must have Corvair valve cover used in construction.
Gravity powered only, no motors, no springs, no

magnets, no jet-propulsion, etc.

3. Maximum weight is 4.5 pounds, no minimum weight.

4. Maximum length 16" long

5. Maximum width 8", inclu3.ding tires.

6. No part of the racer can hang over the start gate, which is 3" in height.

NOTE: It is recommended that entrants make their racers with the wheels being the widest part of the racer. **Racetrack Specifications:** The below is the standard, however, if we're utilizing a borrowed track from another club, then the differences will be accommodated. 1. Track launch ramp to be 24 feet long, starting four

feet high. Total length to be 40 feet.

2. Track to have sides and a center divider. Outside rails to be one inch high and the center divider to be 3/4" in height.

3. Starting gate area to be 16" in length.

4. Starting gate to be 3" in height.



Race Procedure:

1. Races will be run in four-car heats, double elimination, so every car gets to go down the track twice.

2. The first four cars signed in are in the first heat. The second four cars signed are in the second heat, and so on.

3. The "Main Event" will be comprised of the respective "heat" winners.

4. No lane hopping, or interference with

competition. First infraction, you get a re-run. The second infraction gets you disqualified, which equates to only one rerun for the entire event, so, stay in your lane! 5. If judges rule a tie, then the cars will re-run that race until a winner is decided. In this situation, re-runs will be made in the opposite lane.

6. In order to count as a win, the racer must finish on their own wheels and in their own lane.
