A Tractor in Hopkins

It's time to pay CMI annual \$20 dues. Mailing a check to Lee Knauf in New Ulm is the best way. We're down from 87 members to 61 at this time but I'm sure for many it's just an oversight. People who don't belong to Corvair Minnesota are squares and nowhere near groovy. I was sorry to miss the Holiday Party at the last minute. I had developed a cough due to cold and these days it's bad form to be around people when you're contagious. If you cough in public people look at you like you've got the plague, of course then you wonder if maybe you do. It just seemed best to stay home and although I'm fine now, you don't want what I had. It sounds like it was a good time and of course I had to get the rundown on who was there and what they were wearing. I do miss it when I don't see my Corvair buddies for a while.

We've been working on Early engines recently. One 61 engine from Don Schaeffer was built in September of 60 and had full fin 60 cylinders but in the 3 7/16 61 size. In taking apart a 63 VD 102 FC engine I learned that a lot of 102s had the stronger rods like they put in the turbos. In taking apart a 62 or 63 turbo engine I learned that the 62s used the 102 cam, the 63s used a special turbo cam, the 64s used the 110 cam and the 65s got a special turbo cam again. Unlike body changes, engine changes were often not done according to year but often slipped in when available or prudent. The 63 turbo cam was also accompanied with a carburetor jetting change. 140 PG engines are another one that had mid-year changes. The first ones in 65 had the 110/140 cam, then they changed to the 95 HP cam retarded 4 degrees with a special crankshaft gear. It's often difficult to tell what you've got with external numbers. I even found the 62 or 63 turbo engine cam doesn't have a part number on it, I'll have to check it with a degree wheel.

Our Leeky Seel Editor John Herkenratt joined CMI in about 1994. He was club Secretary for a time and then Fran talked him into taking over the Leeky Seel about 2007. He got a few years off when Chris Bacon took over but then got it back, probably in a weak moment. The whole Corvair thing started out when he saw a white 68 coupe at a Garage Sale and got it for his eldest son as a good first car. He drove it for a while but got into a Nova. The second son then had it for a time but got into an Audi. In the meantime John caught the bug and had a dark blue 64 coupe from Art Rogers in Eden Prairie; a red 65 4 speed coupe with a walnut shift knob and coco mats from Ken Anderson in Minnetonka; a yellow 65 convertible from Andrew Pietenpol's sister; a white Rampside with a 140 from Wisconsin that seems to be a keeper came along in 1999; a blue LM 4door that came from Gary Nelson and went to Annandale when someone just had to have it; and the copper colored Greenbrier 140 PG that came from Bill Gautsche in Eau Claire and went to Floyd Ackley in Pine City. Before Corvairs he liked Impalas and I remember him having a 54 or so Chevy with power windows. You will often see John and his wife Heather at car shows and other activities, they're fun people to be around. It's been a while since I've been in there but I remember their house in Hopkins being well maintained and restored so it's like stepping into the 60s. I especially remember the period correct bathroom fixtures and basement steps with linoleum treads and chrome stair nosing. Speaking of Ken Anderson, I came into possession of a cameo beige and white 66 140 PG convertible that he used to have. It's a real cream puff and John has first right of refusal when I get it running, I think it suits him and he is down to just one Corvair. If you're ever in Hopkins and see a guy on a John Deere tractor it's probably John Herkenratt.


