Good question. Recently there was some discussion of whether or not DACC had insurance for some of our events. I checked with the National club's leaders and the answer is yes. As a chartered chapter of the Corvair Society of America (CORSA) we have insurance. This policy allows us to conduct meetings such as the monthly one at the 300 Bowl. For events like our annual Homecoming, we do need to request a certificate for the Hotel. If we were to sponsor a timed event like an autocross or a speed event (drag racing your Corvairs?) there would be an additional charge for that. Does this mean that only CORSA members are covered? No. The coverage is for our chapter. Membership in CORSA is not a requirement for membership in DACC. It is recommended for reasons just like the insurance that they provide so we can play with our Corvairs. Many other National car clubs first require membership in their group and THEN you can join a local organization. Not so with us. You can choose your level of involvement. I've been a member of CORSA ever since I first heard about them back in the late '70's. I recommend that if you are enthusiastic about our hobby, think about joining CORSA. # DACC History 1987 Continued by Clark Hartzel July Aircooler:

Treasurers report \$745.19. 6 cars and 5 vans attended the meeting. We got a plaque from the Rochester show for having 12 Corvairs show up. The Ziebart demonstration was a success. The Belleville Parade was a success but only 5 Corvairs showed up. The July activity will be the 4<sup>th</sup> of July parade in Cass City. Dave Taylor has joined the Masters of Disasters as he drove 450 miles to Syracuse for their annual recall mini convention with his damper doors closed. The engine got so hot it burned the paint off the shrouds. He also cooked the O-rings, and they were leaking. His lug nuts also came loose, and the wheel started wobbling. Fortunately, Pete Koehler and Clark Hartzel were with him and helped him fix things. He eventually won 1<sup>st</sup> place in the show.

#### August Aircooler:

115 paid members and 12 who owe dues. \$503.19 in treasury. Senior citizens (62 or older) will get a break in dues at half price. 22 Corvair cars, 2 Rampsides and 1 Greenbrier attended the meeting. 13 Corvairs attended the Cass City 4<sup>th</sup> of July event. Pete Koehler was selling AC Delco parts to members. July 11<sup>th</sup> found 5 Corvairs and one old Plymouth cruising Port Huron. Pete K wrote a lengthy article about the CORSA national convention and some of our members had car trouble. Don Armer wrote another lengthy article about acquiring a Greenbrier. Again Jay Shuster drew a funny picture about DACC being on the road. September Aircooler:

Pete K wrote an article about acquiring a 1963 Spyder and the City of Farmington Hills giving him a ticket for displaying a junk car in his driveway. He had to go to court to remedy the situation.
