

Shifter Tips

Recently Mark Welte installed new bushings in a LM Corvair shift tube. He provided the following hints to aid theprocess.

Important instruction highlights easily missed when installing Clark's C1 Bronze Shifter Bushing Kit:

- The bronze bushing(s) must be test-fitted to the shifter rod prior to installation. The bushing(s) are under-size and must be reamed (or sanded) to fit your shifter rod.
 - The screws provided in the

kit are NOT used as set screws to hold the bushing(s) in place. With the bushing in position, holes for the retaining screws are drilled through BOTH the shifter tube AND the bushing. A longer selftapping screw is used to create threads in both the shifter tube and bushing. The self-tapping screw is removed and replaced with a short screw with star lock washer threaded into both the shifter tube and bushing to hold it securely in place. Caution: Do not to over-tighten the screws, with the limited thread depth available they can be easily stripped.

- The installed short retaining screws MUST be checked to verify they do NOT protrude through the bushing to bind on the shifter rod. This can occur depending on the amount of reaming necessary for the bushing to accommodate your shifter rod. If needed, remove the offending screw(s) and shorten with a file, sand paper, or grinding wheel, and reinstall.
- On final assembly I suggest using Loc-Tite on the screws to insure they are retained securely.

EZ Speedo Lube Trick

This question was posted recently on Corvair Owners Group Facebook page:

My speedometer pegs to 100 at like 30 and is accompanied by a terrible noise until I slow or stop

Is it the square bit on the back of the cluster slipping? It's a new cable and a replacement cluster which I guess could have the same problem as my old one.

It worked properly on a drill up to like 60 before I installed it, and there was nothing broken-looking. The force of the first speedometer's smack on the peg broke the counterweight off, so I'm not attaching the cable until I can be sure this won't happen anymore. The end of the cable spins smoothly at all speeds

Roger Ringelstetter provided this answer:

The speedometer head is the problem, I remove the cable and slip a 3/8 or 5/16 fuel line hose on the back of the speedometer where the cable was removed, the hose has to be long enough to come out from under the dash and hold above the speedometer a little, I then put an ounce of light oil in the hose and use low air pressure to force the oil to the speedometer, it has worked for me for two different cars with your exact symptoms, it's much easier with the speedo on the bench. NOT MY FAULT if it doesn't work or it somehow made speedometer non-repairable.


