

Summer/Winter Plate?

A couple of MCCA members have been taking extended drives in their Corvairs during the 100 degree heat and experienced the alarming flicker of the Temp/Press warning light on the dash. Air cooled engines need all the help they can get during hot weather.

One of the initial problems when driving the prototype Corvairs in cold weather was carburetor icing. To cure the icing it was necessary to get warm air to feed the carburetors. In '61-'64 Corvairs a flap was cut into the thermostat door and bent up to allow warm air from the exhaust manifold area to enter the engine compartment. However in hot weather the last thing needed in the engine compartment is super heated air.

The manuals suggest bending the flaps back flush during the summer. A better solution is to cut a 2" x 5 1/2" strip of sheet metal to cover the slot and add a couple of screws to hold it in place. Most of the time there are flaps under the generator/alternator and under the distributor.

The system was redesigned for the '65 and later Corvairs. They came from the factory with

a removable plate that included instructions. Some included a leg to hold the thermostat door slightly open, some were flat.

Coming home from Tri-State one year Keith Hammett was having heat issues on his LM. The plate was missing so it was replaced with a flattened Coke can.


