### **DACC History 1990 by Clark Hartzel**

January Aircooler:

President: Ken Hand; Vice President: Ken Pepke; Secretary: Linda

Hand; Treasurer: Marvin Granger

Editor: Bob Kirkman; Membership: Gordon Fee; Parts and Service: Clark Hartzel; Activities Pete Koehler. GM said we cannot use the Training Center anymore, so we need to find a new place for the club meetings. The cover has a picture of Earl Wright's "Right 1" Corvair drag racer. It was a 1965 Turbo Corsa. He ran it stock and turned times in the 14 seconds at 95 MPH. After removing everything that wasn't needed for racing.140 heads and a 2-barrel carb plus fiberglass hood and trunk lid it ran low 13's at 110 MPH. Personality Profile was written about 6 new members, Restoration Report was written about 5 members who were restoring their cars or their engines, Treasury is \$1272.28. Don Arner's late 4-door was destroyed when a speeding EMS truck ran into the side of the Corvair. The car was totaled. Fortunately. Don was not injured and was wearing his seat belt. Jim Westervelt wrote an article explaining the duties of all the officers. The annual election of officers is in March.

The list of the clubs' bylaws were printed. A list of the price of all Corvairs by 5 different conditions was printed from Old Cars Weekly. This issue of the Aircooler was 20 pages (10 sheets of paper) long and mailed for 45 cents!

February Aircooler: A picture of the assembly line showing front suspension and powertrain being installed was on the cover. Pictures on pages 2-5 were shown of featured Corvairs. The list showed Ken Hands "Toy" race car; Pininfarina 1961 restyled Corvair; Jim Walsh's shortened Corvair built by former DACC member Ted Mick; Dyna Track military vehicle; John Fitch's Phoenix; "Stubby" the shortened Corvair by Bob Kirkman; A Corvair laying on it's side at Ken Hands garage; The Monza GT; Vern Bailey's dune buggy; The Testudo Italian creation; The Super Spyder; The Corphibian in water, Pete Koehler's Ultra Van and a Cord 810. The guest speaker is Chuck Willard who was a field service engineer. The meeting was in the GM Service Research building just south of the Training Center. This issue was 12 pages and mailed for 25 cents.

March Aircooler; The cover picture was a convertible rusting in the woods with the top down. It said "Think spring! Get that priceless Corvair out of winter storage. It's almost parade and show time!" The May 1974 first newsletter was reprinted in this issue. Dave Gould reported that two of his Corvair vans were stolen from a storage lot in Detroit. Each van was full of Corvair parts. President Ken Hand has talked to Dave Guindon about club meetings at Uniroyal/Goodrich. Looks good and board approved. Around 1950 there was another air-cooled car built. It was the Julian with a rotary type of engine mounted over the rear axle. Talk about a mini meet at the Signature Inn on I-275 in Plymouth.

A ballot for election of officers by mail was printed in this issue. Bob Kirkman wrote about a top head stud pulling out of the block and how to fix it with two heli-coils and how to install the coil springs in the front suspension. Ken Pepke announced that Clark Hartzel won the driver's award with Kirkman and Koehler tied for second place. Bob Kirkman wrote about installing bottom shrouds on his 1960 to prevent carb icing.

April Aircooler: President: Ken Pepke; Vice pres: Pete Koehler; Sec. Adele Kirkman; Treas: Marvin Granger; Memb: Bob Kirkman; Edit: John Allesee; Parts: Dan Weir; Activ: Pete Cimbala; Parades: Sharon Pepke. April activity is a convoy to the Tri-State show and swap in Bryan, Ohio. Bob Kirkman warned about fuel leaks from old stock pumps if they are pressurized by an electric pump. Current membership at 131. Treasury at \$1,248.42. Ken Pepke asked us to contact a member who hasn't showed up lately and try to talk him into coming back.

Dues \$12.00 per year. Board meetings at various members homes. Dan Weir wrote an article on getting your Corvair ready for the season. One good idea was storing the cars on jack stands and try to open the doors. If the car sags so much the doors are difficult to open, you probably have a rust problem. This is important on convertibles as the top ads

no strength to the chassis as does hardtops and sedans. May Aircooler: We have a new meeting place. Dave Guindon has talked his boss into letting us meet at Uniroyal/Goodrich in Troy. Pictures of Don Arner's Corvair that was totaled in an accident in Detroit. It seems he and an EMS truck tried to occupy the same space at the same time. Congratulations to Rex and Sue Hamil who got married in Las Vegas. Jim Walsh mentioned a Fraser Rotary Club picnic and car show on July 22<sup>nd</sup>. John Zelenak's Corvair will be raffled off. Two films were shown. "From here to there" and "Daring the Darien." Talked about hosting a CORSA national convention in 1992. Did you know that Ken Hand and Kurt Graham had a disc jockey business called Laser Sound Productions? They did 50's to 80's music at weddings, birthdays, dances, parties. A personality profile was written by Bob Kirkman about new member Jim Morgan. Along with two show Corvairs he owns 6 other classic cars including a 1948 Lincoln Continental worth about \$50,000. Don Arner advertised a red Rampside pickup and a turquoise and white Greenbrier for sale and a bunch of parts. June Aircooler: Treasury \$1,021.61. Membership 128 paid up with 9 past due. June 10<sup>th</sup> is a garden party at Kathy Mucha's place in Windsor, Ontario. June 23/24 is the Sloan Museum summer fair. June 30th is the Cass City parade. An article about cutting a 1-3/8 dia. Hole in the bottom of the bell housing to fish out pieces of a broken starter nose cone. Oil leaks because of cracks in the PG shift cable being fixed by epoxying the crack. I found it easier to clean the cable and just wrap it with black electrical tape. When a Powerglide car sits for a while the torque converter leaks down into the pan and over fills it leading to pan gasket leaks and shift arm/shift cable leaks. Four Corvairs caravanned to Bryan, OH and others drove by themselves. About 20 of our club showed up. Stu Shuster talked about the GM Staff Employee Car Show. We can enter it. Jim Walsh provided flyers on the Car show in July. Bob Kirkman wrote about fixing his windshield wiper switch. An article in the Detroit News talked about all the various ways that car heaters were made over the years. The first true heaters were Charcoal affairs. You set the charcoal on fire and when the flames settled down you carry the device out to the car and you were ready to go. The first true car heater was built by Stewart Warner in 1934 and they sold 3,500,000 of them.
